

## Highlights

- On 29 December 2013, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps located in 10 provinces was 210,635 including 153 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 26-29 Dec. 2013, a total of 1,568 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,560 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Local authorities in Viransehir camp informed UNHCR that the refugees continued to approach the camp during the weekend. Reportedly there are more than 2,000 Syrians who have spontaneously arrived at the gate of Viransehir claiming to be new arrivals from Syria and other provinces in Turkey who would like to be admitted to the camp. The camp officials stated that some of these people are already registered in Ceylanpinar camp; however they claim to have relatives in Viransehir camp and would like to unite with them.
- UNHCR is advocating for the admission of those who arrived spontaneously and not yet registered in any camp. The camp officials in Viransehir stated that they have established rub-hall tents to temporarily accommodate these people and provide them with hot meals until a decision is taken by AFAD HQs in Ankara. Reportedly they will be placed in the camp in Nusaybin which will be ready to admit people during the first week of Jan 2014.
- UNHCR continues to provide support to the camps for winterization. In addition to 2000 heaters sent to Ceylanpinar camp, upon request from the camp management, in coordination with AFAD Ankara, UNHCR will send 1000 more heaters to Ceylanpinar camp on 02 Jan 2014. Also 500 heaters will be sent to Kahramanmaraş camp in Jan 2014.
- Upon request from the camp management, in order to ensure sustainability of the vocational courses on maintenance of electrical outlets, UNHCR provided tool kits for maintenance to the Adana Saricam camp. In Nizip-2 container camp, in coordination with the local authorities and camp management, the UNHCR Field team initiated a "graffiti arts" project with participation of 30 teenagers. UNHCR provided supplies and material for the project. In coordination with the camp officials, UNHCR will also provide training to all the interpreters (about 500-600) working in the camps.
