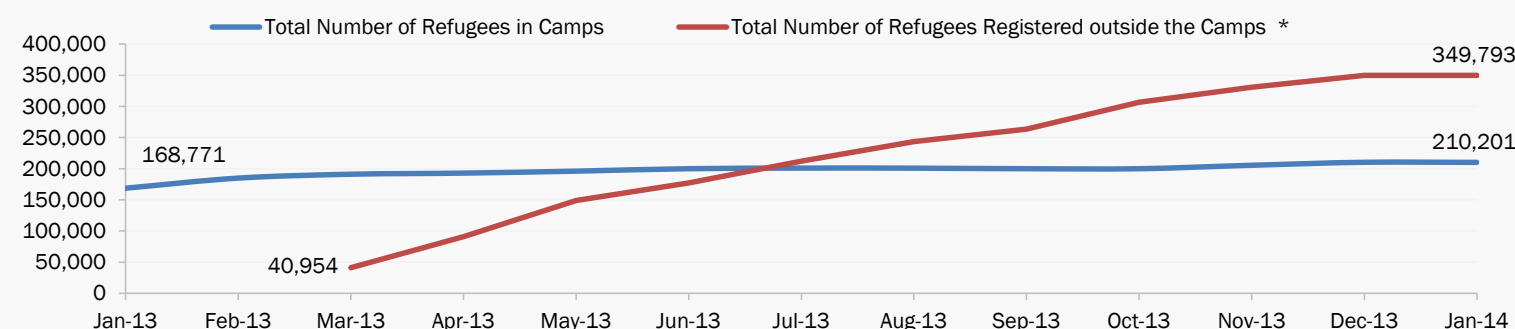

Highlights

- On 01 January 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps located in 10 provinces was 210,201 including 105 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the first 24 hrs. of 2014, a total of 378 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 377 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- According to the official figures reported by AFAD, the number of Syrians registered and accommodated in the camps increased by 42% during the year of 2013. According to the information obtained from local officials (AFAD, provincial governorates and the foreigners police) the number of registered and enumerated non-camp Syrians in 10 provinces where the 21 camps are located increased to about 350,000. The vast majority (almost 90%) of this total are reportedly living in 5 provinces (Hatay, Gaziantep, Kilis, Sanliurfa and Mardin).
- On 01 January 2014, AFAD reported that since the beginning of crisis (April 2011), more than 2 million polyclinical services (more than 11,000 per day) have been provided to the Syrians in the field hospitals in the camps. Reportedly of this total medical interventions, there were more than 327 thousand referrals to State hospitals (882 per day) of whom 43,600 were hospitalized and 33,692 medical surgeries were conducted to the Syrians. It was also reported that 7,945 new-borns were recorded since April 2011.
- As of 01 Jan 2014, in 21 camps, 45,696 children are attending schools in the camps of whom about 6,000 are in kindergarten. In addition to the children attending schools in the camps, more than 27,000 adults have benefited from vocational courses and as of 01 January 2014, more than 9,100 adults are still attending various vocational courses. Reportedly there are 1,923 teachers working in the schools in the camps, of whom only 377 are Turkish and the rest are Syrians.
- UNHCR will continue to provide support to the Government of Turkey's response to the needs of Syrian refugees. For the ongoing winterization activities UNHCR is providing blankets for up to 240,000 beneficiaries, clothes for up to 63,000 children (2-17 years) and electrical heaters will be sent to the camps upon requests from the camp managements.
