

Highlights

- On 07 January 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 21 camps located in 10 provinces was 210,203 including 104 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of 06-07 Jan 2014, a total of 350 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 286 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR Team was informed by the local officials in Mardin that on 07 Jan 2014, a group of about 500 Syrians who were temporarily accommodated in the rub-hall tents at the gate of Viransehir camp have been transported to Nusaybin Camp. A UNHCR Team visited Nusaybin camp and observed that one of the districts of Nusaybin Camp has been prepared to accommodate initially up to 3,000 persons and UNHCR was informed that the refugees who are at Viransehir camp gate are to be transferred to Nusaybin camp in groups during the coming days.
- During the visit to Nusaybin camp, UNHCR Team met with some of the refugees who were transferred from Viransehir camp to Nusaybin Camp. Some of the refugees UNHCR staff stated that they came first to Kilis and have stayed in the transit center for a while and then moved to Viransehir while some stated that they had come directly from Syria.
- In Mardin, UNHCR Team visited a new school for the children of non-camp Syrians living in Mardin province. The school staff informed UNHCR that they are funded by a Turkish NGO as well as by a charity organization from Kuwait. Reportedly the school will have about 18 classes in total where about 20 Syrian teachers will work. Initially there are 6 classes for about 300 children who were registered to school for 1-6th grade classes. The school will be officially opened next week.
- It was reported in the media that the fights between the opposition groups and Islamists have intensified in Tel Abyad and surroundings in Raqqa region. It was also reported in the media that Akcakale and Karkamis border gates are closed for security reasons. UNHCR is in close contact with the local officials to monitor if there is any influx of Syrians to the border.
