

Highlights

- On 08 January 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 210,561 including 115 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the 24hrs of 07-08 Jan 2014, a total of 619 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 351 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- After the transfer of the first group (approximately 500) of Syrians who had been waiting at the gate of Viransehir camp to Mardin Nusaybin camp, on 08 January 2014 AFAD has presented Nusaybin camp as a new Syrian refugee camp in its Daily Information note. This has brought the total number of operational camps to 22 while the Transit Center in Kilis is still kept closed for renovation.
- Local officials in Viransehir camp informed that they will continue to transfer the remaining of the 3,000 people waiting at the camp gate to Nusaybin camp. Reportedly some of the first transferred group refused to stay in Nusaybin and stated that unless they are accommodated in Viransehir they would like to return to Syria. UNHCR is closely following up with the authorities regarding these developments.
- UNHCR Teams were informed by NGOs that some few thousand new arrivals have crossed from Tel Abyad to Akcakale. UNHCR has been in close contact with the local officials as well as MFA representative in the region for the verification. Reportedly according to the local government officials during the last 2-3 days about 1,500 Syrians including non-passport holders have been admitted to Turkey from Akcakale border gate. While it was reported in the media that Akcakale border has been closed for security reasons both for commercial traffic and individuals to/from Turkey/Syria, the officials stated that those who approach the border gate seeking protection are admitted. UNHCR will continue to be in close contact with the local officials on the situation at the border in case of any influx.
- After the completion of the renovations in Ceylanpinar camp during the last few months of 2013, the markets were established and as of beginning of the new year the food system in the camp also switched to e-card system. The program is not within WFP coverage but the food allowance is the same (80 TL per person) loaded by AFAD to the cards issued by AFAD.
