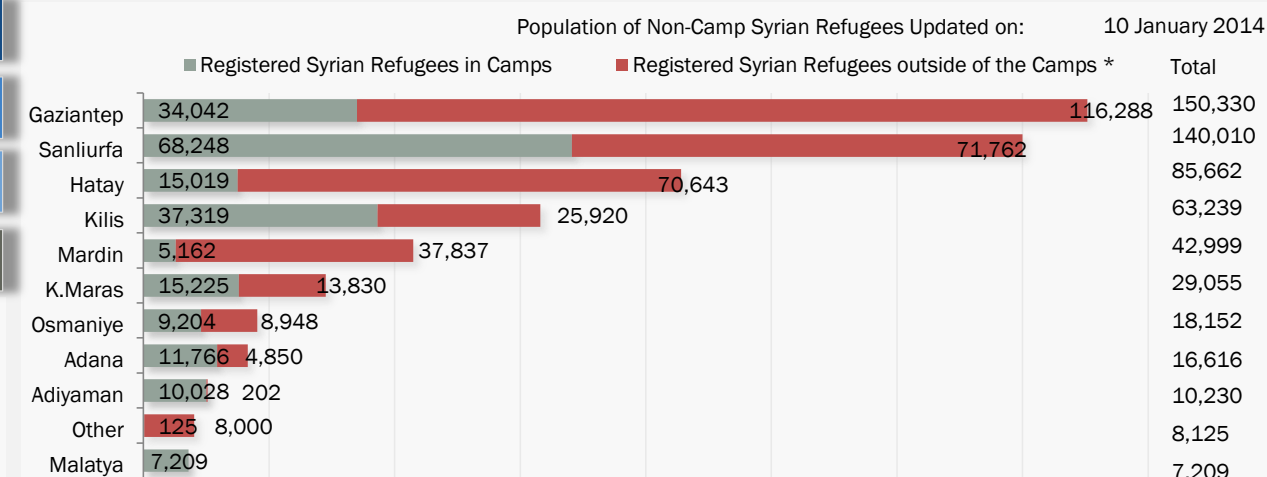
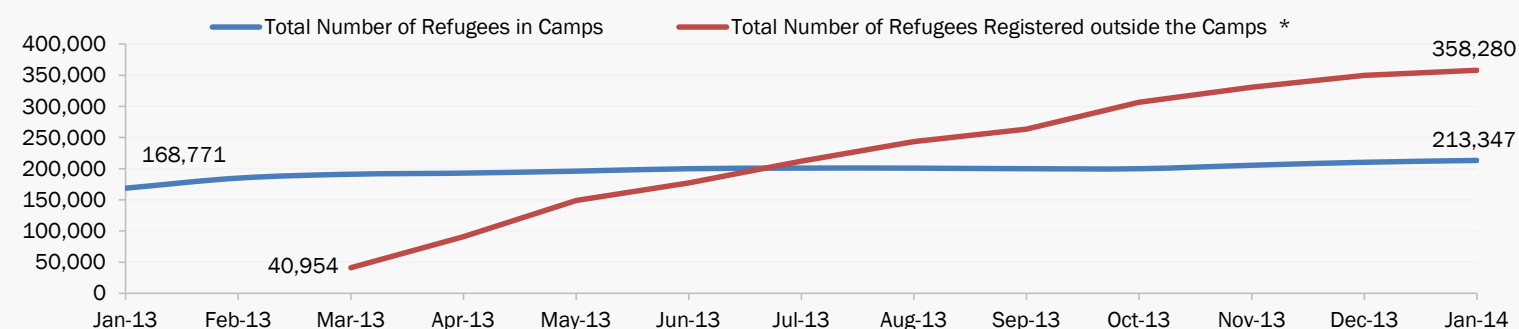

Highlights

- On 16 January 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 213,347 including 125 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 15-16 Jan 2014, a total of 305 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 302 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Local officials in Kilis informed UNHCR that due to the clashes in Azaz across Oncupinar, there are several hundreds/thousands of new arrivals observed. The officials also informed UNHCR Team that the number of IDPs in Bab Al Salame across Oncupinar is estimated to be about 16,000 persons. Reportedly all the tents (rub halls) which were in the Transit area in Kilis were removed and sent to Bab Al Salame.
- In Viransehir the officials informed that there are 283 Syrians who were temporarily accommodated in the social activities area, another 50 new arrival Syrians spontaneously approached to Viransehir camp during the week-days.
- In Viransehir camp, officials informed that as of next week, there will be 3 supermarkets opened in the camp and the food distribution will be switched to card system while related allowances will be loaded by AFAD to their AFAD Cards. The camp management also received a truck full of second hand clothes which will be distributed to the camp residents.
- In Kilis Elbeyli, camp officials informed that despite not having space to accept more people, during the week, they admitted 41 new arrivals spontaneously approached to the camp. Reportedly these people were not only the immediate family members of the camp residents but also were vulnerable such as elderly and disabled. Camp officials also stated that about 100 camp residents records were in activated (de-registered) since they have left the camp for about 1 month ago and did not report back.
- In Kilis, the local officials informed that the distribution of coal assistance to non-camp Syrians is still on going. In Elbeyli camp, the volunteer teachers were provided food packages while about 4,000 diapers were also distributed to the camp residents.
