<p>SOP rollout plan</p>	<p>In light of the launch of the National SOP on CP and GBV, an interagency project was initiated including SCI, IRC, UNHCR, UNICEF, UNFPA and the NCF to support the rollout of the SOPs. The project will be involving all members of the sub-working groups as well.</p> <p>Relevant documents were already circulated to the GBV SWG, including a concept note and a work plan to define how each member would like to be involved in the rollout. The next main activity will be a three days ToT from the 10 to the 12 of Novembers. <p>16 days of activism</p>	<p>The 16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence is an international campaign created in 1991. It runs every year from November 25, International Day Against Violence Against Women and December 10, International Human Rights Day, in order to symbolically link violence against women and human rights and to emphasize that such violence is a violation of human rights. The chosen theme of the year is “Let’s Challenge Militarism and End Violence Against Women” and the campaign color is orange.</p> <p>In collaboration with the UN Communication Team, the GBV SWG will create a calendar with all the activities of the members, and other interested acotrs. A calendar taplete will be circualted for input. Futhermore materials and messages will be produced by JNCW in collaboration with the UN communicaiton team. To practically participatete in the process, members are invited to take part inad hoc meetings on the 16 days. <p>Deployment of GBV advisor</p>	<p>The GBV SWG has the opportunity to deploy the GBV AoR Rapid Response Team Advisor for four weeks between November and December. An initial draft of the ToR was prepared on the basis of the GBV SWG strategy and it includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Support the SWG members to develop a methodology and Terms of Reference to conduct a capacity assessment of GBV services provided in host communities and a gap analysis; - Provide technical support to and identify opportunities for the development of relevant advocacy materials to address; - Provide technical support to define key tasks for the GBV mainstreaming focal points <p>Working group members also suggested:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Support to plan awareness raising sessions modules on GBV - Support to create a model for service delivery to home-bound women and girls - Better analysis of injuries reports and connection with primary health in Zaatri specifically <p>As a mission of four weeks will not be sufficient to achieve all of the above, the coordinators in collaboration with the advisors will have to select a feasible number of tasks. <p>AOB</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - UN Women updated the GBV SWG on the inter-agency assessment on the impact of the Syrian crisis on the host communities, which is being prepared in the context of the host community platforms. Gender will be mainstreamed throughout and there will also be a specific chapter. - The case management task force met earlier this week and discussed mainly how to collaborate with NCFA on various issues including the accreditation system. Moreover to strengthen the case management system, with the help of various agencies, key local CBOs will be identified and be involved in a thorough capacity development process. - UNHCR is organizing sensitization training on LGBTI protection which will be held in Amman on the 13 and 14 of November. The training targets UNHCR and interested partners in order to look into possible ways to support LGBTI individuals in need of protection.
