## NEEDS

- Households have access to basic and domestic items (NFIs)
- Persons with specific needs are supported (NFIs)
- Basic needs of Syrian refugees in camps and urban settings are met (NFIs)
- Sufficient supplies received in time (Logistics)
- Establishment of logistics system for contingency purposes, including a central warehouse, core relief items stockpiling and transport arrangements/distribution

## OBJECTIVES

- Population has sufficient basic and domestic needs (NFIs)
- Support to persons with specific needs provided (NFIs)
- Logistics and supply optimized to serve operational needs (Logistics)

## KEY DEVELOPMENTS

The procurement process of 240,000 high-thermal blankets for winterization assistance by UNHCR is almost complete. All arrived in Mersin Port and are under customs clearance process.

Delivery of the 23 mobile registration/coordination centres for AFAD by UNHCR is on course. During December, 7 of the centres were delivered to AFAD, a total of 14 delivered so far. 11 additional mobile registration/coordination centres are in production process and will be delivered to the Directorate General of Migration Management in January.

An additional 13,800 electric heaters were delivered to UNHCR Central Warehouse in Gaziantep. 5,300 units of these heaters were distributed in 6 camps to counter the winter conditions.

Of the 316 dish washing containers procured, 34 have so far been delivered and 100 still at the supplier's warehouse, waiting for the location information from AFAD.

Through a frame agreement, 2 million winter clothes for Syrian refugees are in tendering process.

On the 18th of December, IOM received an in-kind donation of 10,000 mattresses and 10,000 blankets from the Government of Japan. In coordination with AFAD and Turkish Red Crescent, the items were provided to Viransehir camp to be distributed based on needs identified. During the same period, IOM and local partners began the distribution of winterisation items in Kirikhan, Hatay province. 450 blankets were distributed to 179 families (consisting of 913 individuals)

The Government of Turkey takes the lead role for determining and implementing assistance provided to Syrian refugees, through the Prime Ministry Disaster and Emergency Management Presidency (AFAD). AFAD reports spending over 2 billion USD on the Syrian Refugee Response in Turkey.

## ACHIEVEMENTS TO DATE



**39,500** mini-fridges delivered for distribution in the camps.



**36,260** metal cupboards delivered for distribution in the camps.



**34,760** hot-plate cookers delivered for distribution in the camps.



**63,701** children in 19 camps provided with T-shirts and jeans.



**3,499** blankets distributed.



**150,000** children in the camps to be provided with winter clothing (distribution started in 6 camps) Distribution of **18,500** tents that were procured in 2012 completed.



**34** mobile coordination / registration centers in procurement; of which **14** have been delivered to AFAD (**7** in December)



**240,000** high thermal blankets for winterization procured (under customs clearance).



**518** wheelchairs procured and delivered.



Contingency items (kitchen sets, medium blankets, jerry cans, sleeping mats, rubhalls) for **40,000** persons procured and kept in stock.



**16,350** oil-filled radiators ( 13,800 in December) for winterization delivered for distribution.



**21** WASH containers (12 showers and latrines and 9 dishwashing containers) provided to camps.



**316** WASH (dishwashing) containers procured; 34 delivered.



**32,606** blankets, bed sheets, pillows and mattresses distributed to 8 camps.



**25** VSAT equipment provided across all the camps to support coordination of registration.



**4** ACs were provided for a clinic for urban refugees, to serve up to 25,000 Syrians living out of camps.
