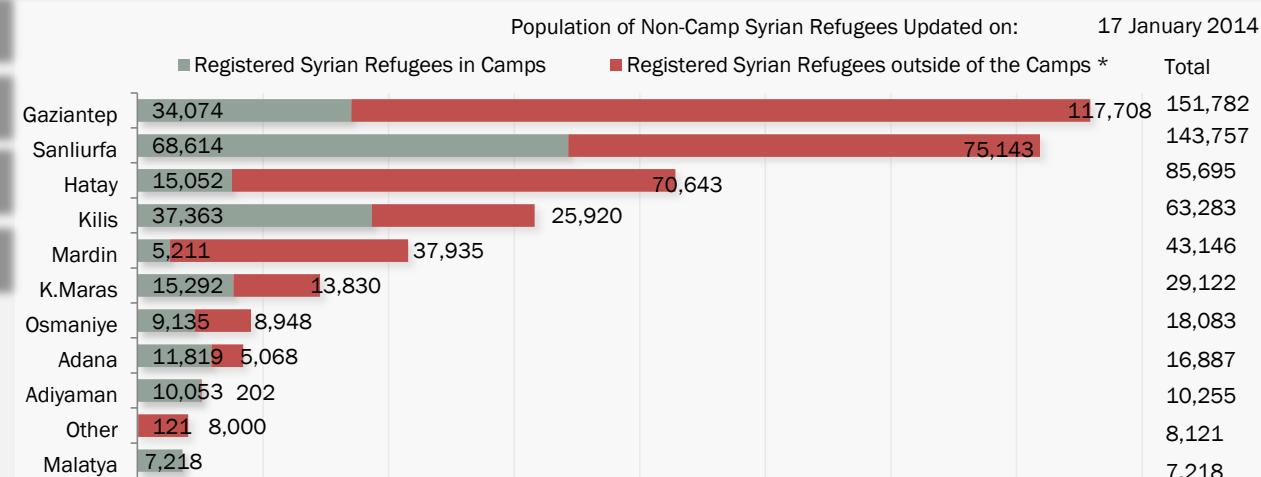
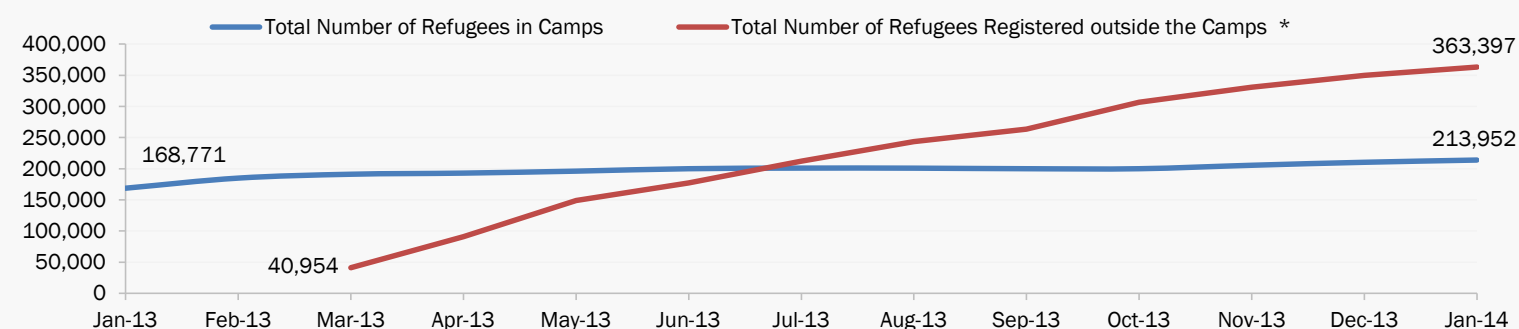

## Highlights

- On 20 January 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 213,952 including 121 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 19-20 Jan 2014, a total of 137 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 101 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria. No new numbers were received from AFAD for 21 January 2014.
- After the registration of those who are accommodated temporarily in the social facilities tents in Viransehir as well as additional new arrivals transferred from Akcakale town to Viransehir, the camp population reached to 9,250 persons. The camp management informed that by early Feb they will received the furniture (desks, chairs, boards etc.) for the school and education is planned to start soon.
- In Nusaybin the camp officials informed that the number of Syrians accommodated in the camp reached over 2,000 persons (421 families) who are accommodated in 70 rub-hall tents which each are divided for 8 families. Reportedly there are about 1,200 children at school age. Reportedly the camp management is working on preparing at least 30-40 classes for the education facilities.
- In Hatay Yayladagi during the visit to urban areas, the local officials stated that they have started to register the non-camp Syrians living in Yayladagi town. The registration process is taking place in Yayladagi camps. The camp officials informed that they are transferring the non-camp Syrians to the camp to register them in the camp. Reportedly the same is applied in for the Syrians living in Altinozu town and non-camp Syrians are registered in Altinozu Tekel camp.
- Local officials confirmed that the number of Syrians who have crossed from Jarablus to Karkamis has reached over 1,400 and they were temporarily accommodated in the sports hall and available public facilities (funeral houses etc.). Reportedly in coordination with AFAD Ankara the new arrivals will be transferred to the camps where there space is available. UNHCR is in close contact with the local authorities for a possible influr and if requested can provide heaters if needed. During meetings with the new arrivals, Syrians reported that they had to escape after ISIS took the control of Jarablus town and border gate.
