

### Highlights

- On 02 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 216,210 including 112 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 31 Jan-02 Feb 2014, a total of 1,697 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 792 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- According to the official figures announced by AFAD the total number of Syrians registered and accommodated in the camps increased by 42% during the year of 2013 compared to the previous year end. In 2014 the camps population increased with another 6,000 refugees as of end of Jan 2014. Of all the non-camp Syrians registered and enumerated within the 10 provinces where 22 camps are located, 90% are registered and enumerated in 5 provinces (Gaziantep, Sanliurfa, Hatay, Mardin and Kilis). Gaziantep AFAD Coordination Center alone registered almost 122,000 Syrians.
- In Adana UNHCR met with a national NGO who informed UNHCR that they have provided cash assistance of 300 TL per family to 1,157 families living in Adana. The NGO also provide food assistance which they receive as donations, as well as non-food items like clothes, blankets and sometimes financial support to cover their rents. The NGO also informed UNHCR that they send support to Syrians in other provinces like Kilis, and Hatay and its towns.
- In Adana Saricam camp, the officials informed that they have received a US delegation composed of private donors and mayors through Turkish American Friendship Association who donated 18,000 blankets. Reportedly the Turkish NGO Kimse Yok Mu facilitated the customs clearance of the blankets and they will be distributed to both camp and non-camp Syrians in Adana. The distribution to the non-camp Syrians will be done through Kimse Yok Mu.
- In Adana Saricam camp, camp officials informed that they have been approached by spontaneous arrivals who request to be admitted to the camp. The camp officials stated that due to shortage of space in the camp, and in consultation with AFAD Hq. the spontaneous arrivals are advised to approach the transit centers in the border towns Reyhanli etc. to be officially referred to the camps where space is available.
