

Highlights

- On 03 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 216,777 including 109 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 02-03 Feb 2014, a total of 804 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 237 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Hatay, local officials informed UNHCR that the registration of the non-camp Syrians in Reyhanli and Kirikhan is being done in the mobile registration units provided by UNHCR. The officials stated that when it is completed in these two locations the mobile registration units will probably be moved to Hassa and Kumlu towns.
- The registration of non-camp Syrians in Altinozu town center has been completed (1,700 persons registered) and officials have started to register refugees in the rural areas of the town. Officials stated that it proves challenging to reach refugees who they had enumerated before as many are moving around for economic reasons. In Yayladagi officials stated that they have also started the registration of non-camp Syrians in the town center and so far 1,100 Syrians have been registered. The officials assume that the number of Syrians in Yayladagi town center and its villages increased to 5,000 of whom 60% are Turkoman origin.
- Kilis Elbeyli camp officials reported that following the admission of new-arrivals through Elbeyli border to Besiriye village last week, with the instruction of the dept. governor of Kilis, 6 families were admitted to Kilis Elbeyli camp due to their vulnerability. During the arrivals, UNHCR also witnessed that a family with a disabled elderly family member was immediately transferred to the camp.
- UNHCR Field Teams were informed that all those who were temporarily accommodated in the rub halls in Karkamis, Islahiye and Nizip-1 camps have been transferred to Viransehir camp. The camp officials informed that they were advised by provincial officials in Gaziantep to keep the rub hall on stand-by in case of need for temporary accommodation of possible new arrivals in the future. As the security situation across the border is fragile officials are reserving some space for temporary accommodation in case of a possible influx.
