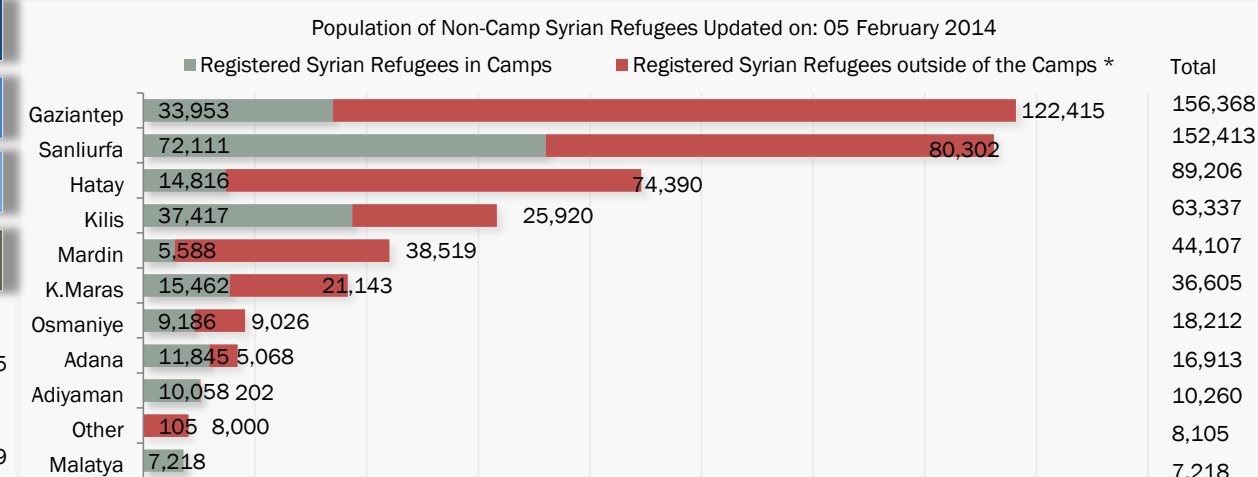
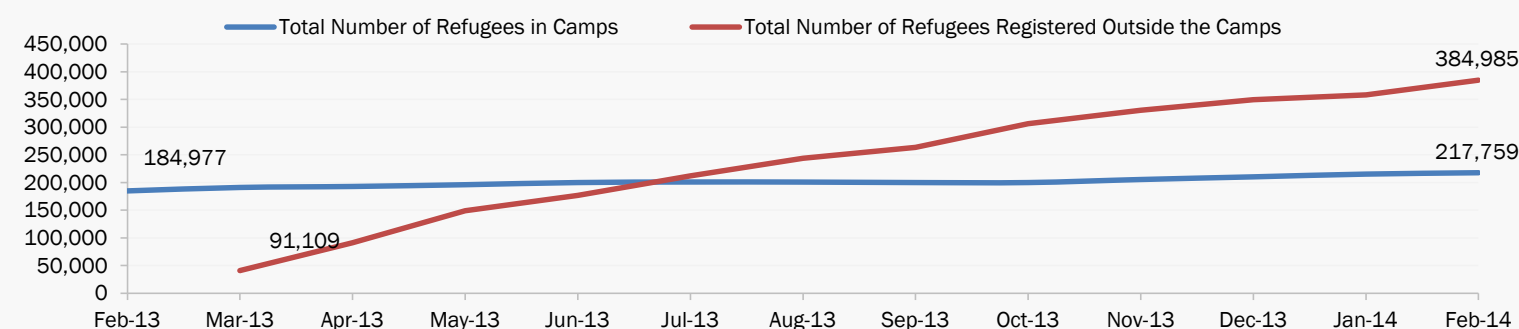

Highlights

- On 10 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 217,759 including 105 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 09-10 Feb 2014, a total of 229 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 147 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria. No new numbers reported by AFAD on 11 Feb 2014.
- In Adana Saricam camp, the officials informed UNHCR that while they receive some spontaneous arrivals they are not directly observing any major influx of new arrivals to the camp. The camp manager stated that due to the shortage of space in the camp, they cannot admit all new-arrivals and priority is given to immediate family members as well as vulnerable refugees. Reportedly others were provided transportation to the main bus station in Adana and are advised to approach other camps.
- During the visit to Viransehir camp, the UNHCR team witnessed several hundreds of Syrians accommodated in front of the camp. The camp management informed UNHCR that there are 900-1,000 Syrians at the gate requesting to be admitted to the camp. Provincial AFAD Officials informed AFAD Hq and are waiting for instructions for their admission to Viransehir camp or their transfer to another camp where space is available. The camp officials also stated that during the waiting period, they are accommodated in rub hall tents and provided hot meals and medical assistance for those in need.
- In Adiyaman, the camp officials informed that the registration of the camp caseload is completed and their ID cards will be distributed during the coming days. The police in the camp informed that they will start the registration of the non-camp Syrians in Adiyaman soon. Local officials estimate there are more than 300 Syrians living in Adiyaman province of whom 180 have been issued ikamets (temporary residence permits).
- In Kilis a UNHCR Field Team discovered that in one of the districts there are reportedly 280 makeshift tents set up in an organized manner where Syrians (mostly Turkomans) are living. According to preliminary information the local administrator (muhtar) installed a few showers and toilettes, but there is so far no other support from the officials. It is reported that the Danish Refugee Council visited two vulnerable families and provided assistance.
