


Highlights

- On 13 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,304 including 110 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 12-13 Feb 2014, a total of 814 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 264 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Local officials in Yayladagi informed UNHCR Team that about 3,200 non-camp Syrians were registered in Yayladagi town center and another 1,200 Syrians living in the villages of Yayladagi. The registration of those living in Yayladagi town center is now almost completed and the officials will continue to register refugees living in the villages of Yayladagi.
- According to the local officials the Akcakale border gate is officially closed for commercial traffic but open to Syrians carrying passports. However, when there is an influx at the border, Syrians without passports are also admitted next to the official crossing. Local officials informed UNHCR that during the period when ISIS took the control of border almost 10,000 Syrians were admitted, of whom some 9,000 of them have been recorded. The officials stated that 186 persons of these admissions were injured and were hospitalized for treatment, 394 of them were transferred to Viransehir and Nusaybin camps, and 1,072 of them moved to urban areas to stay with their relatives. The vast majority of the new-arrivals returned to Syria after a few days during the same period.
- In Viransehir the camp officials informed that as per instruction from AFAD Hq, 39 non-camp Syrians living in Edremit town of Balikesir and 28 Syrians living in Konya have been transferred to the camp. All these new-arrivals have been admitted to the camp and registered. In addition to these new arrivals, the camp management has also accepted immediate family members amongst those who are in the waiting area rub halls. For the others the management is still waiting for instruction from AFAD Hq. With the recent admissions, the camp population has increased to 12,345 as of 13 Feb 2014.
- The spontaneous arrivals continue to arrive in Nizip town. The head of religious affairs in Nizip informed that they often receive new-arrivals approaching mosques where they are temporarily accommodated. The coordination Center in Nizip informed that the number of non-camp Syrians registered in Nizip has increased
