


Highlights

- On 17 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,565 including 109 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 16-17 Feb 2014, a total of 119 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 51 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The registration unit in Ceylanpinar camp informed UNHCR Team that there are about 270 Syrians in the waiting area in rub hall tents. Camp officials informed that about 170 of this group were brought from Akcakale town by the authorities during the weekend while the others have approached the camp individually or in smaller groups. UNHCR Team spoke to some of these new arrivals and they claimed to have arrived from various crossing points including Kilis, Reyhanli, Karkamis and Akcakale borders. The registration unit in Ceylanpinar camp informed UNHCR that all these new arrivals will be admitted to the camp and the registration of the 170 Syrians from Akcakale have been completed and the others will also be registered.
- A UNHCR Field Team visited Suruc town of Sanliurfa where AFAD reported that as of 14 Feb 2014 more than 4,000 non-camp Syrians have been registered. During the visit, UNHCR met with a group of 75 people living in 15 makeshift tents established in the outskirts of Suruc town. The Syrians stated to be of Kurdish origin and working in the agriculture as field workers and do not want to be placed in any camps. The local authorities in Suruc informed that the non-camp Syrians were registered by SASF (Social Solidarity and Assistance Fund) office and are provided assistance through local donations. A Turkish NGO provided 676 blankets and 1,276 food packages.
- The local authorities informed that the military crossing point in Mursitpinar is officially closed for entry and exit but emergency cases (wounded people etc.) are admitted. The sub-governor of Suruc also informed that humanitarian aid including food, medicine and other types of NFIs were delivered across the border crossing through Turkish Red Crescent.
- Last week there were about 900-1,000 Syrians waiting at the gate of Viransehir camp to be admitted. While those with immediate family members are admitted to Viransehir camp, the others are planned to be transferred to Nusaybin camp. Last week 350 refugees were transferred to Nusaybin and another 300
