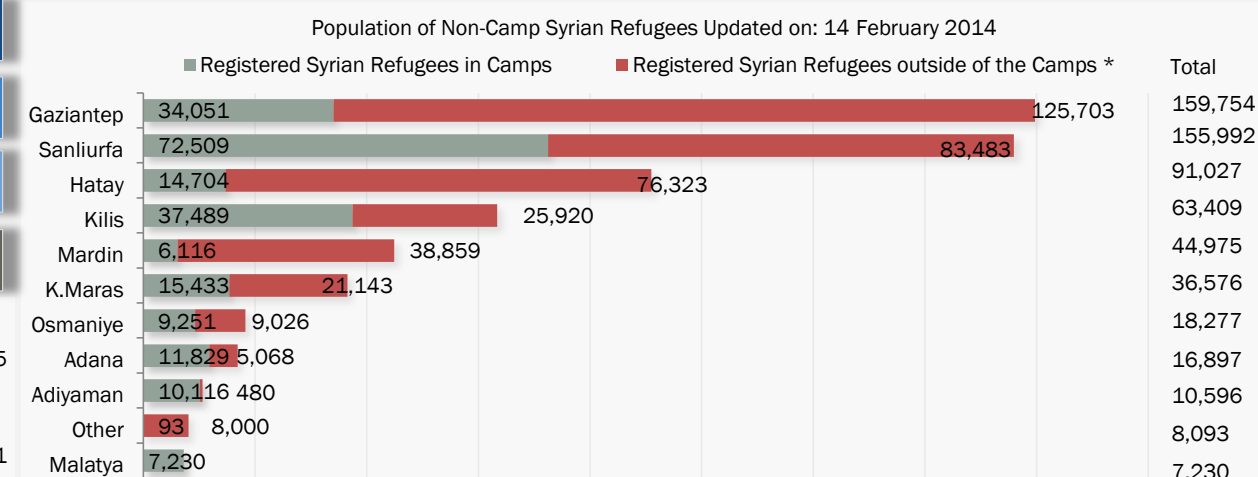
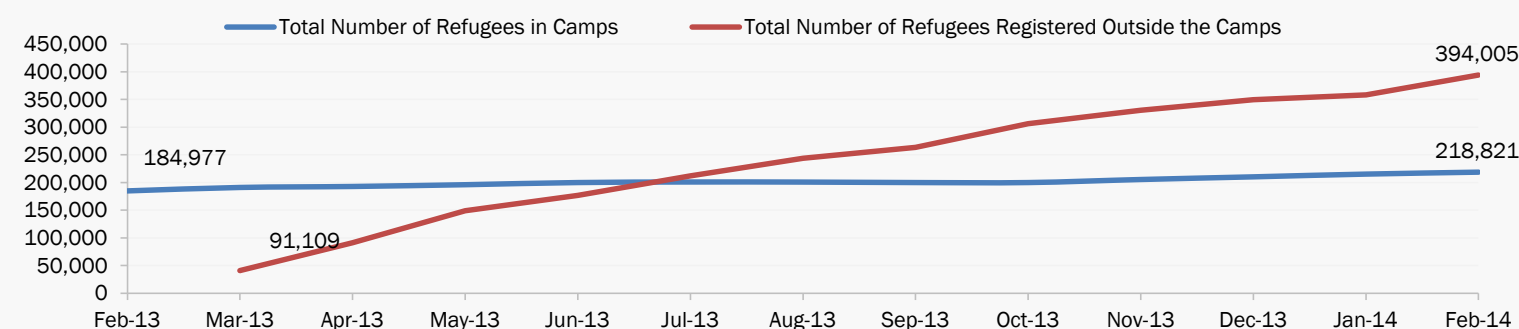

## Highlights

- On 19 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,821 including 93 Syrians receiving medical treatment in hospitals. AFAD reported that during the period of 18-19 Feb 2014, a total of 374 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 83 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR Field teams observe an increase of new-arrivals in various locations. In Nizip the Registration Coordination Center informed that as of 19 Feb. the number of registered non-camp Syrians increased to almost 18,000 while there are many others given appointments to be registered. The head of religious affairs in Nizip informed that the number of Syrians temporarily accommodated in the mosque increased to over 400 and reportedly more people have been arriving. He furthermore informed UNHCR that they are assisting 2,400 families in total with food packages through the donations they receive from local community.
- In Kahramanmaraş, the foreigners police informed UNHCR that the number of non-camp Syrians registered in Kahramanmaraş Province reached to almost 23,500 persons as of 19 Feb 2014. Reportedly more than 20,000 Syrians are living in city center while about 1,100 have been registered in other towns and villages of Kahramanmaraş. The police also informed that about 2,060 Syrians were issued ikamets (temporary residence permit) in Kahramanmaraş province as of 19 Feb 2014.
- During a visit to Kilis, UNHCR Team also observed that several hundreds of Syrians are living in makeshift tents established in the outskirts of Kilis. UNCHR Field Team met with the Syrians staying there who stated to be of Turkoman origin, and who explained that they came from Aleppo during the last few days to 1-2 months. While some have been registered with the Coordination Center in Kilis, the most recent arrivals stated that they are on the waiting list for registration. The residents stated that they do not want to be placed in a camp.
- In Kilis, UNHCR was informed by the officials that the number of IDPs in camps across the border of Kilis is increasing depending on the security situation in the region. Reportedly the admissions from the IDP camps is limited to the available space in the camps. Dep. Governor of Kilis informed UNHCR that this week 9
