
### Mission

Handicap International (HI) is an international NGO with 30 years of experience providing tailored services to the most vulnerable populations, including persons with injuries, persons with disabilities, persons with critical health conditions and older persons. HI is currently active in more than 60 countries in both development and emergency contexts, including six countries in the Middle East: Egypt, Iraq, Lebanon, Jordan, the Palestinians Territories and Yemen.

In the Region, through its Emergency Response Division (ERD), HI aims to mitigate the impact of the current Syrian crisis on the most vulnerable persons and their families by responding to both their basic and their specific needs, as well as promoting and supporting the inclusiveness of the humanitarian response.

In Jordan, HI relies on a wide network composed of 4 Offices, 15 Focal Points, 50 Outreach teams and multiple national and international partners from which the staff is trained and supported by HI to enhance identification/referral mechanisms as well as accessibility of services provided.

Through the Age and Disability task force, at both Zaatari and national level, HI contributes to coordinate interventions in these fields, while also ensuring that Age and Disability considerations are mainstreamed into sector planning and activities.

### Geographic Focus

In 2014, Handicap International have appealed for funds in Protection, Health and Cash Assistance for the following area of interventions: Irbid, Ajloun, Jarash, Mafraq, Zarqa, Balqa and Amman Governorates, as well as for Zaatari and Azraq Camps.

HI has 2 Offices in Amman, 1 in Irbid and 1 in Mafraq. Also, HI has 1 compound in Zataari Camp and 1 compound in Azraq Camp. Besides, HI is present in Ramtha and Dulayl Hospitals, as well as in several JHAS clinics and JOHUD Princess Basma Centers throughout the country.
