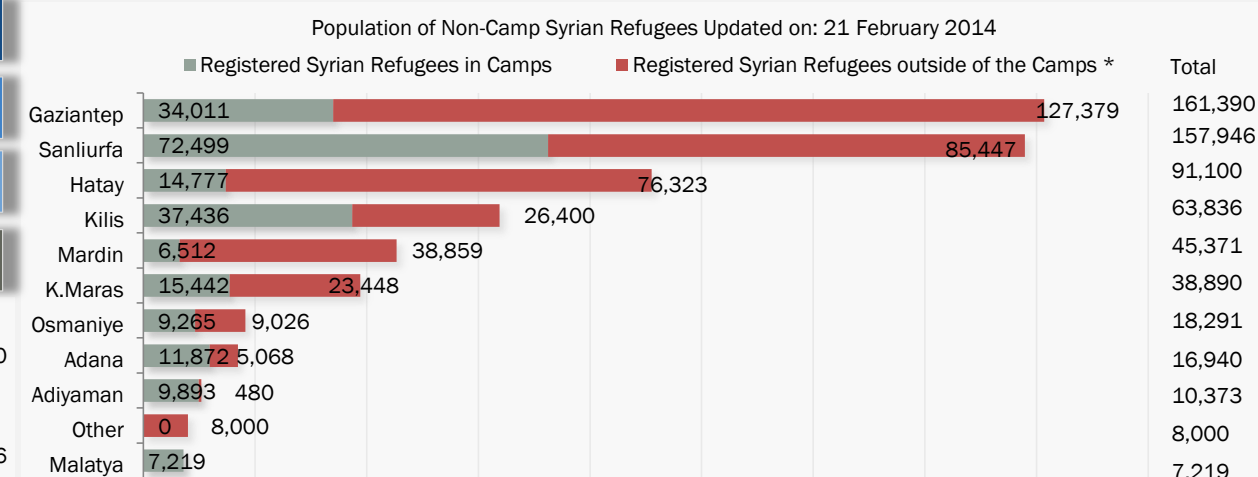
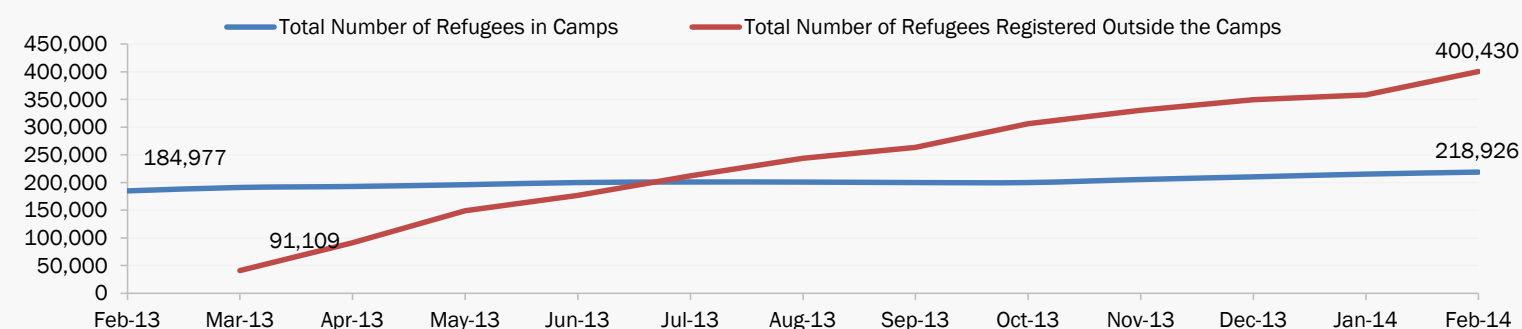


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	619,356

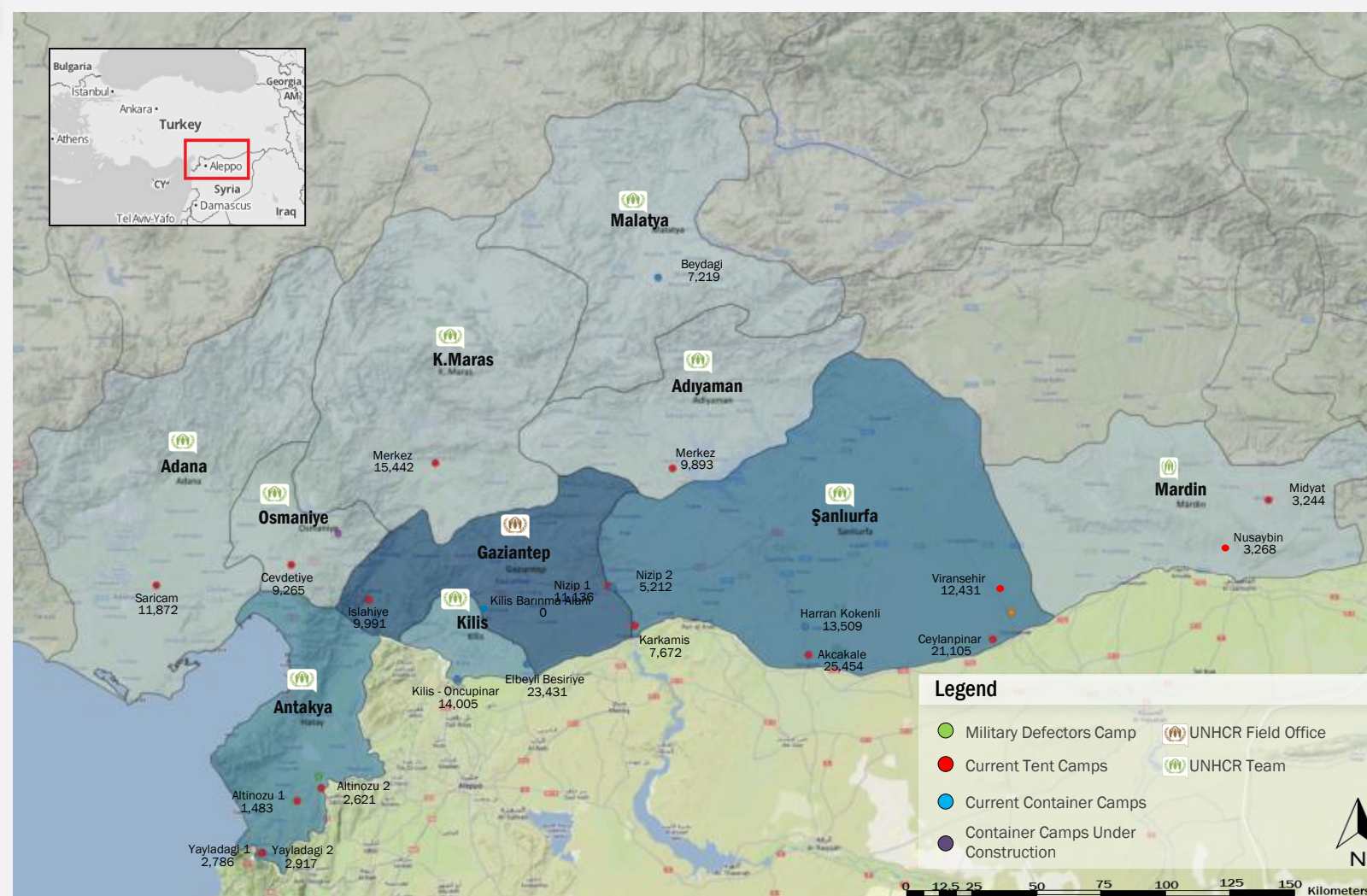


Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



Highlights

- On 26 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,926. AFAD reported that during the period of 25-26 Feb 2014, a total of 365 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 532 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Spontaneous arrivals continued to approach the camps. In Ceylanpinar camp UNHCR Team observed that about 10 families were waiting outside the camp while another 33 families (about 150 persons) were temporarily accommodated in the waiting tent. The camp management informed that they have already admitted another 100 people, registered them and accommodated in the camp. The management stated that they are doing their best to identify available tents in the camp to be able to admit all the others in the waiting area.
- The camp management of Ceylanpinar stated that the spontaneous arrivals are not all direct arrivals from the border but sometimes are the people who have been living in other provinces and decided to approach the camp. The UNHCR Team talked with some of these new-arrivals who stated that they came from Hatay or Kilis borders while some stated that they had also approached Viransehir camp before.
- In Viransehir camp, although the camp management continued to admit Syrians with family members in the camp, the number of people in the waiting area is still between 500-700 people. Reportedly some of those who were sent to Nusaybin in the previous weeks have returned to Viransehir camp. The management informed that they have registered some 150 people of those who have family members/ relatives already registered in the camp. In the admission criteria, the management gives not only priority to those with family members in the camp but also to the elderly, women with children and medical cases.
- The camp manager of Viransehir also informed UNHCR that they have received an official letter from AFAD Hq. on the admission of about 329 Syrians who were reportedly referred from Adana. It is not stated whether these are sent from Adana urban or camp and as of 27 Feb 2014, the group had not arrived at the camp yet.
