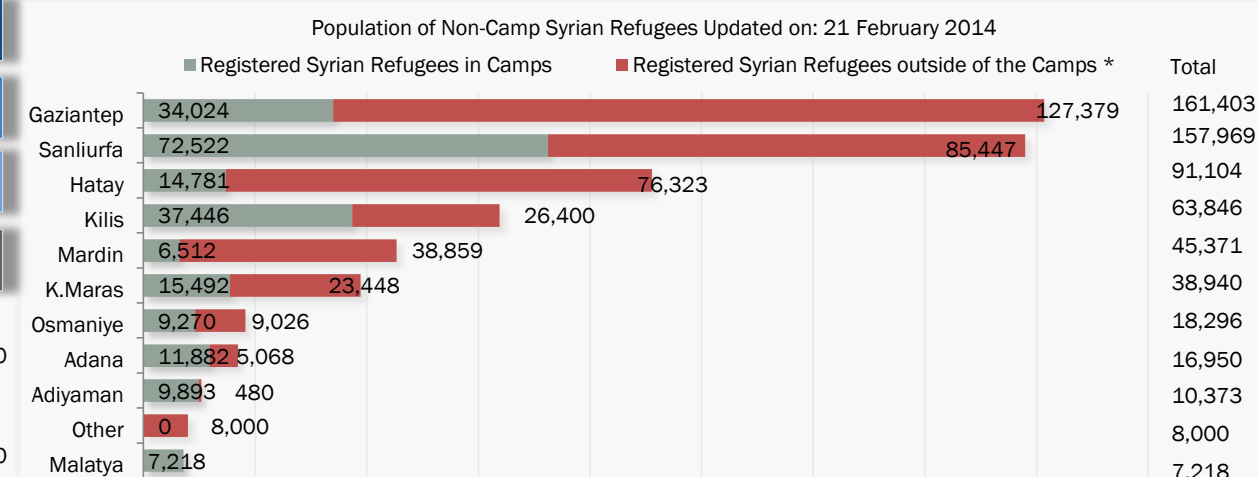
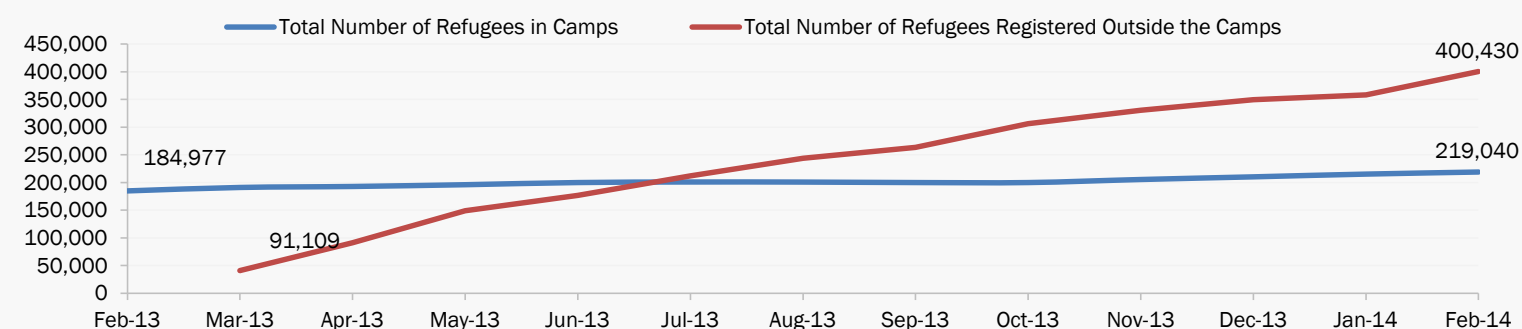

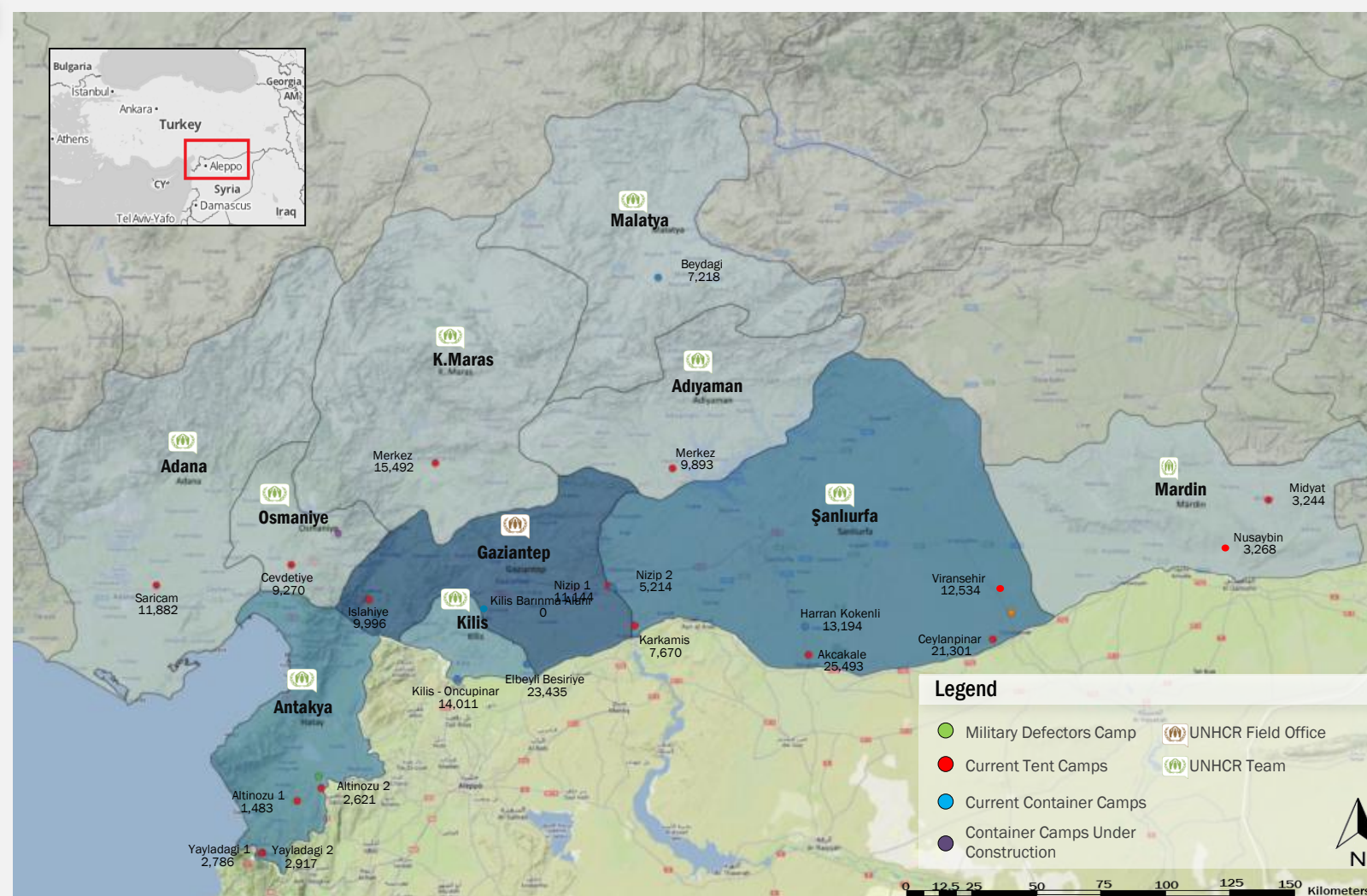


## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 27 February 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,040. AFAD reported that during the period of 26-27 Feb 2014, a total of 429 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 315 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- During the week, AFAD Hq informed UNHCR that 12 Mobile Coordination Centers were sent to the 8 provinces. Reportedly Hatay, Gaziantep, Kilis and Sanliurfa provinces received 2 each while Kahramanmaraş, Osmaniye, Adana and Batman received 1 each. This was confirmed by local officials. The two centers in Hatay are placed in Reyhanli and Kirikhan towns and have already started to register the non-camp Syrians. The two which were sent to Urfa were placed in Akcakale and city center. In Gaziantep, AFAD informed that one of the two centers will be placed in Nizip while the location of the second will be decided later. Local authorities in Islahiye are requesting one to be placed in in Islahiye town for the registration of non-camp Syrians.
- The Coordination Center in Nizip informed that as of 28 Feb 2014, almost 18,500 persons were registered in Nizip and more people who arrived recently are awaiting registration. In Islahiye, the sub-governorate informed that about 6,300 Syrians were enumerated in Islahiye town while a local NGO estimates it the number to be more than 8,000.
- Upon request from the Turkish NGO called YTB the Ministry of Interior agreed to issue temporary residence permits (IKAMET) to students who are qualified to study at Turkish Universities. The residence permit will allow the students to open bank accounts and get their scholarships given by YTB. UNHCR will also provide one time cash assistance to these University students.
- On 28 Feb 2014 the UNHCR training to the interpreters working in the camps was completed. The training started in early January 2014 and included more than 850 camp staff working as interpreters in the camps.
