KEY NOTE OF THE MONTH


Shelter agencies continue to assist a widely dispersed refugee caseload

JANUARY HIGHLIGHTS:

Concerted efforts by agencies to complete weatherproofing shelters as part of the winterization plan resulted in more than 30,000 refugees (15.8% of the target group) receiving assistance. This achievement amounts to 97.3% coverage of the plan to target around 194,000 refugees living in infromal settlements, unfinished houses, worksites, and other forms of sub-standard living conditions.

New shelter space within collective shelters and houses that can be rehabilitated are being identified by agencies in order to accommodate the increasing number of refugees, including those that have become victim to eviction. Rehabilitation of houses will particularly benefit host communities as well as securing accommodation for refugees.

NEEDS ANALYSIS:

Shelter remains critical throughout the country hindered by a growing reluctance of local communities to provide additional shelter space in collective shelters or to allocate public land for formal settlements.

Expanding on the intiatives of MOSA from the Arsal emergency in 2013 to increase the number of shelters in formal settlements from 20 to 70 or more and to install temporary shelters in the vicinty of collective centres and individual houses are steps to increasing shelter options. Nevertheless, these options remain dependent on the acceptance of hosts communities.

In the absence of larger, managed sites, the identification of empty houses and buillings that can be rehabilitated and used by refugees for shelter remain a more viable option.

Many shelter agencies are still without confirmation of their funding, hindering the planning process for the implementation of the shelter strategy.
