<b>SCI My Dream My Right Presentation</b>	<p>- SCI and partners launched a national campaign around child labour (<b>My dream..My right</b>) last week and a video on living on scrap.</p> <p>- Children are working because their families need the income; gov bodies are not attentive to children in the informal sector. Current child labour legal framework does not recognise children in the informal sector (film focused on children working in scrap ).</p> <p>-currently no criminal law relating to truancy or employers of children.</p> <p><b>Suggested Plan of action:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-legislative reform to include children in informal sector; penalise employers; enforcement of compulsory education for children</li> <li>-raise awareness – community outreach</li> <li>-compile government to establish mechanisms on the</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ <b>Video available on Youtube and to be circulated by Chair.</b></li> </ul>

	<p>ground</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-strengthen educational services</li> <li>-agree a common framework of recognition across MoSD, MoE and MoL of children informally engaged in labour.</li> <li>-Parliament to expedite work on a draft law that was presented in 2012</li> </ul> <p>Discussion of role of local government in reporting and referral: currently not systematised but , while JPD informed that municipalities and governors can deal with on a case by case basis – limited to stating that a particular child cannot be engaged in labour again, but does not have effect beyond that child.</p>	
<p><b>Child Labour Action Plan</b></p>	<p><b>Action plan was shared with CPSWG (see attached the updated Action Plan).</b></p> <p>Suggestions for additions to action plan</p> <p>First objective</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-comprehensive legal analysis of frameworks applicable to child labour</li> <li>-start with law enforcement with shopowners, in view of the current legal framework; possible only situation where enforcement can be done immediately</li> <li>-hiring agencies – guidance before monitoring; consider including clause for contractor to undertake not to sub-contract – may be able to circumvent the absence of punishment in current national legal framework.</li> </ul> <p>Second objective</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-change name to child-focused services for children engaged in CL.</li> <li>-need more interventions for children engaged in labour</li> <li>-include leaflet on referrals and presentations at camp management meetings to increase referral capacity</li> </ul> <p>Education objective</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-need to include ESWG Amman and Zaatari in responsible agencies</li> </ul> <p>Community outreach and awareness raising</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-peer to peer awareness raising – Save Jo</li> <li>-include inter-agency CP/SGBV key messages</li> </ul> <p>Data collection</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ <b>Chair to coordinate with Amman CP and SGBV SWGs on Inter-Agency key messages for circulation</b></li> <li>➤ <b>Chair to circulate revised version of action plan</b></li> <li>➤ <b>Members to review Zaatari referral pathway and communicate comments to Chair for next round of printing and Amanda.melville@savethechildren.org</b></li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- referrals to SCI.</li> <li>- include referrals to other sectors – education, eg</li> </ul> <p>Education/informal education (supporting strategy)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Save Jo – peer outreach</li> <li>-focus on staff awareness and awareness for children</li> <li>-referral mechanism for children engaged in child labour is important to ensure that a child is not over subscribed to programmes</li> <li>-tracking system –teachers inform Save Jo of children who have not attended school for more than ten days, Save Jo follow up.</li> <li>-need to include the quality of education</li> <li>-include FGDs with household</li> </ul>
