


Highlights

- On 25 March 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 223,550. AFAD reported that during the period of 24-25 March 2014, a total of 1,413 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 398 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Although the Akcakale border gate is reported officially closed due to security concerns, local officials in Akcakale stated that during the last weekend about 613 Syrians were admitted through a crossing point 8 km west of the border gate. Reportedly the group of Syrians who fled were mostly Kurdish origin and they were pushed by ISIS who controls the area and Tel Abyad border gate across Akcakale. Local authorities informed that after their safe admission, new-arrivals were transferred to the coordination center to be registered. So far, only about 250 of them arrived at the registration center. Reportedly the others went to unknown destinations, presumably to their relatives living in towns.
- It was reported that fights have been ongoing in Kobani area across Mursitpinar/Suruc, so far without any increased influx to Turkey. UNHCR is also in contact with officials to monitor whether the heavy fights in Kasab border gate across Yayladagi/Hatay, have led to any influx. According to unofficial sources, due to security reasons and fighting very close to the border, it is not safe for people approach the border.
- In Nusaybin the camp officials informed that yesterday about 40 Syrians approached the camp spontaneously and requested to be admitted to the camp. The new arrivals stated that they are from Aleppo and crossed the border from unofficial crossing points to Kilis and went to Nusaybin on their own means. Camp officials decided in consultation with the local authorities, to transfer the new arrivals to Midyat camp where they were registered and accommodated.
- In Islahiye, camp officials reported that they have received about 210 Syrians who were transferred by the provincial AFAD Directorate to the camp as they were living in dire conditions in Gaziantep city center. Due to shortage of space in the camp, the group was temporarily accommodated in the waiting area in rub hall tents pending for their transfer to another camp with the approval of AFAD Hq.
