



## Highlights

- On 30 March 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 224,316. AFAD reported that during the period of 28-30 March 2014, a total of 916 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 543 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR was informed by unofficial sources that armed clashes have intensified across the border of Elbeyli camp in the Cobanbey Area. UNHCR has been in close contact with the local officials as well as the camp officials and reportedly there has been no influx yet towards Turkey borders. Also in Hatay, despite the fights continued across the border, there was no influx to Turkey over the past days.
- According to the official figures from AFAD, since the beginning of the crisis, more than 475,000 Syrians have been registered and accommodated in the camps while more than 251,000 of them have returned to Syria voluntarily. Since the end of Dec 2013, the number of Syrians registered and accommodating in the camps is increased by 6% while the registered non-camp population in 10 provinces has increased by 27%.
- In Mardin, local officials informed that the police continues to facilitate the safe crossing of the Syrians who want to return to Syria voluntarily. Reportedly during the period of 01-21 March 2014, the return of almost 7,000 Syrians was facilitated by police via Senyurt to Derbasiye. It was also reported that during the same period of time, about 1,365 Syrians spontaneously approached the police in Senyurt to be referred to camps.
- In Mardin, the officials informed that during the period of 01 Jan - 21 March, around 3,179 Syrians were referred to hospitals for medical assistance. This is approximately 40 referrals per day. The officials informed that all medical bills will be covered by AFAD as long as the applicant is referred through the formal referral mechanism which requires the applicant to go to a State hospital. No private hospital bills are fully covered unless the beneficiary is referred by the State hospital.
