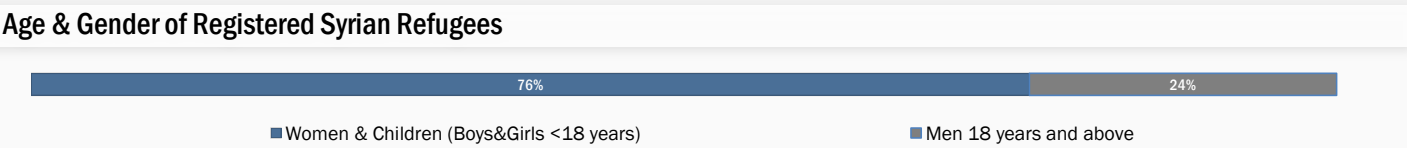
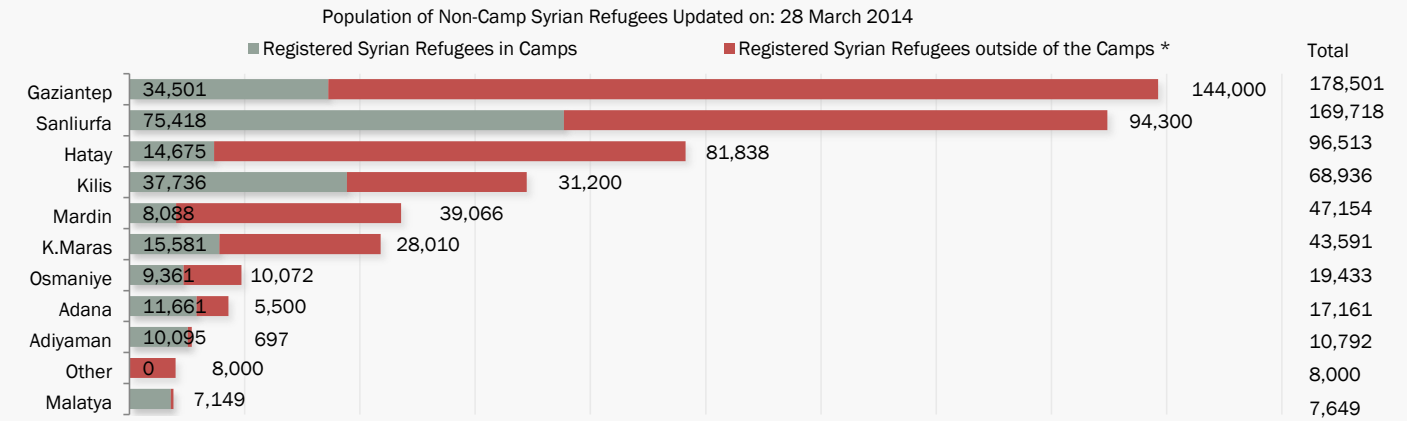
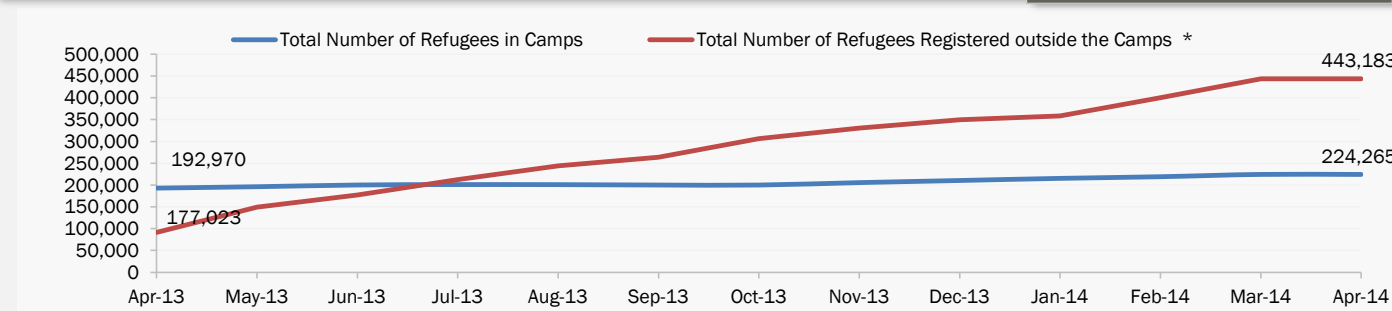

Highlights

- On 03 April 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 224,265. AFAD reported that during the period of 02-03 April 2014, a total of 413 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 601 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Adana, the UNHCR Team was informed by a local NGO that they have provided assistance packages to about 250 families, with food, clothing, shoes and some stationery supplies for children. Another 36 families were provided stoves. The same NGO is working with the Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundation (SASF) of Adana and plans to open 4 soup kitchens in various locations in the city aiming to provide daily hot meals to about 250 persons in each location (1,000 persons in total).
- In Reyhanli town of Hatay, local officials informed that the registration of the non-camp Syrians is still on-going and that as of 02 April 2014, 28,488 non-camp Syrians have been registered in Reyhanli town center. Officials are expecting to complete registration in the town center in the next 2-3 weeks and then will start to register those in the villages around Reyhanli.
- In Ceylanpinar camp officials informed UNHCR that during March they have admitted and registered about 500 spontaneous arrivals to the camp. Camp officials informed UNHCR that as of 3 April, there are still hosting 90-100 refugees who had approached the camp spontaneously during the last 3 days. The officials are waiting for instructions from AFAD Hq for the admission and registration of these new-arrivals or their transfer to another camp.
- The UNHCR Field Team was informed by the camp managements of Nizip-1 and 2 Karkamis camps that 3 truck-loads of clothing were sent as a donation from the LCW clothing company. Reportedly the clothes included both winter and summer clothes. Two trucks were sent to Nizip-1 and Nizip-2 camps and one to Karkamis camp. The clothes will be distributed among the camp residents according to established needs.
