





## Sector highlights from March

### WASH:

- Oxfam have started installation of new WASH blocks in district 8
- Distribution of **3,800M<sup>3</sup> of water** is ongoing every day
- De-sludging of **1,700M<sup>3</sup> of wastewater** is ongoing everyday
- The design for the planned water network in Zaatari will soon be finalised

### PROTECTION:

#### Verification update:

- The verification exercise that started on 27 January 2014 has so far registered **49,843 individuals**
- **36,000 are active** and 4,850 individuals have been deactivated
- 2,260 individuals are on hold
- **57.5%** of the active individuals are children
- **7,055 (19.6%)** are under 5 years old

### NON-FOOD ITEMS:

- The following items were distributed in March: diapers, rainboots, hygiene kits and jumpers.
- The following items are planned for April: Diapers, hygiene kits, TOMS summer canvas shoes.

### SHELTER:

- **275 caravans** were distributed between 23-27 March. In March 2014 a total of **1,090 caravans** were distributed in Zaatari. Since the beginning of 2014, a **total of 4,708 caravans** have been distributed.
- UNHCR Field Unit staff continue to carry out caravan distributions with the support of IRD, NRC and the Jordanian police

### HEALTH:

- The oral polio vaccine campaign, conducted between 2-5 March in Zaatari by IRD, UNHCR, MoH, UNHCR and UNICEF, **immunised 13,877 children** under 5 (98% coverage).
- MSF Holland are now operational in Zaatari. They run a post-operative care facility for war-injured patients.
- A caravan has been installed at the Reception area for JHAS health staff to follow-up new arrivals who require immediate medical attention.

### EDUCATION:

- **12,500 students** are attending school in Zaatari.

### FOOD:

- In March WFP and Save the Children finished monthly food distribution cycles and shifted to food vouchers only. Vouchers will be distributed twice a month with a value of 10 JD.
- School feeding Programme is on-going in 3 schools in Zaatari with distribution to **12,638 children**
- The 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle of March completed on 27 March covering **90,763 beneficiaries**
- Food voucher distribution will start 2 April targeting **100,822 beneficiaries** with 10 JD food vouchers, dates and date bars.
- A donation of dates from Saudi Arabia will also be distributed in the first cycle of April: family size 1-4 receives 2kg, family size 5-10 receives 4kg, and family size 11-19 receives 6kg.
- Daily distribution of **22.5MT of bread** is on-going.

## New arrivals and registration update

### Statistics from reporting period 20-26 March 2014

- **3,770 individuals processed** in Rab'a Al-Sahan during the reporting period which is an increase of 21% compared to previous week.
- **88% new arrival and 12% re-entry**
- **57% are minors**
- **95.6% entered Jordan through eastern border crossings** (89.3% entered to Jordan through the crossing at Ruwaished - Hadallat and 6.3% through Al Rogoban - Sub Rogoban).
- **Area of origin in Syria:**
  - 43.5% from Dar'a
  - 12.4% from rural Damascus
  - 11.3% from Homs
  - 8.7% from Aleppo
- **35,081 individuals processed in Rab'a Al-Sahan** since the opening date (29 December 2013); **89% new-arrivals and 11% re-entry.**
- **435 Government organised returns to Syria**
- **530 birth certificates** (cumulative figure for Zaatari)
