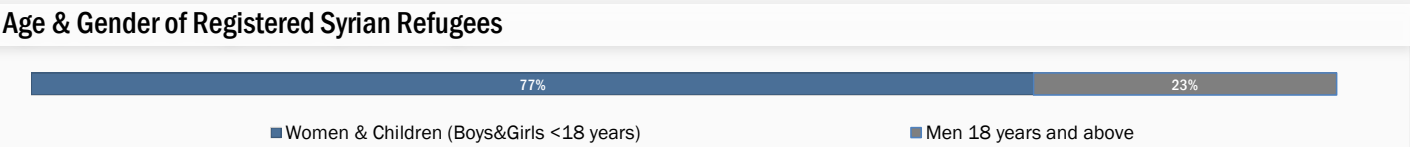
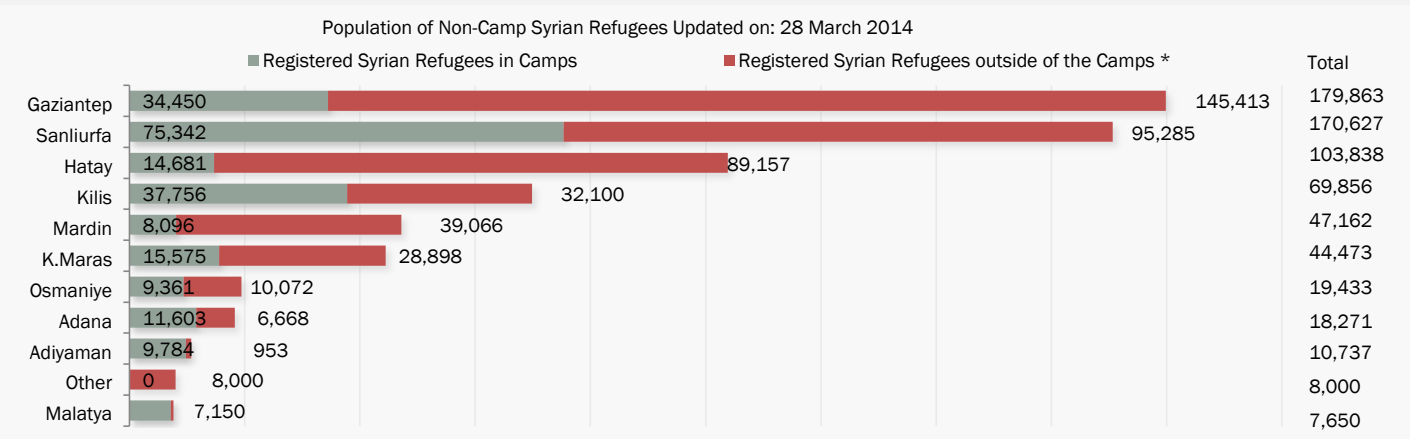
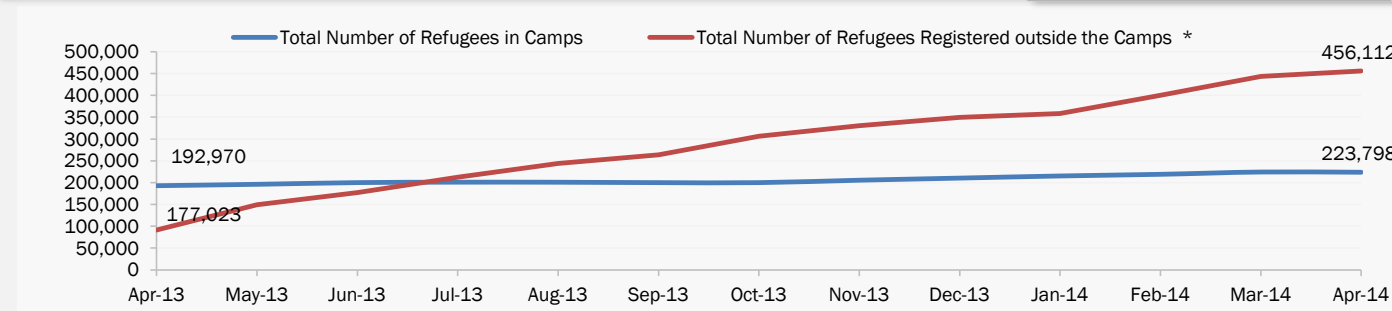

Highlights

- On 07 April 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 223,798. AFAD reported that during the period of 06-07 April 2014, a total of 409 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 252 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Adiyaman camp, after intensive advocacy of UNHCR Field Team, a Youth Committee was established. During the previous week the Committee had its first meeting with the Camp management, in which UNHCR also participated. The committee is composed of 10 women and 9 men. It was agreed that the committee will identify significant problems or needs in the camp and will report to the camp management to find solutions together.
- The camp management in Islahiye reported that last weekend they sent 210 Syrians of those temporarily accommodated in the waiting area to Nusaybin camp, however only 90 of them accepted to stay in Nusaybin. Reportedly, of the others 90 returned to Islahiye, while the others found their way to unknown destination. Those 90 who returned to Islahiye were re-accommodated in the waiting area and are provided hot meal on daily basis.
- In Viransehir, the camp management informed UNHCR that over the weekend they have received 32 Syrians of Palestinian origin. As per instruction from AFAD, all were registered and accommodated in the camp. The camp management also informed that they are expecting another 100 Syrians, who reportedly will be sent from Istanbul as per AFAD instructions.
- UNHCR was informed by provincial officials in Mersin that the estimated number of Syrians in Mersin reached over 50,000, of which some 20,000 are issued ikamets, while another 5,000 are registered by the police in the new registration data-base.
