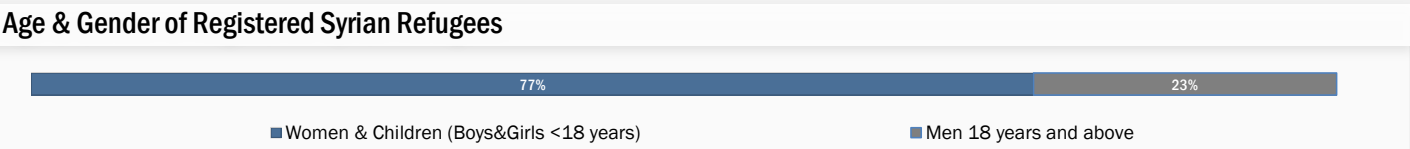
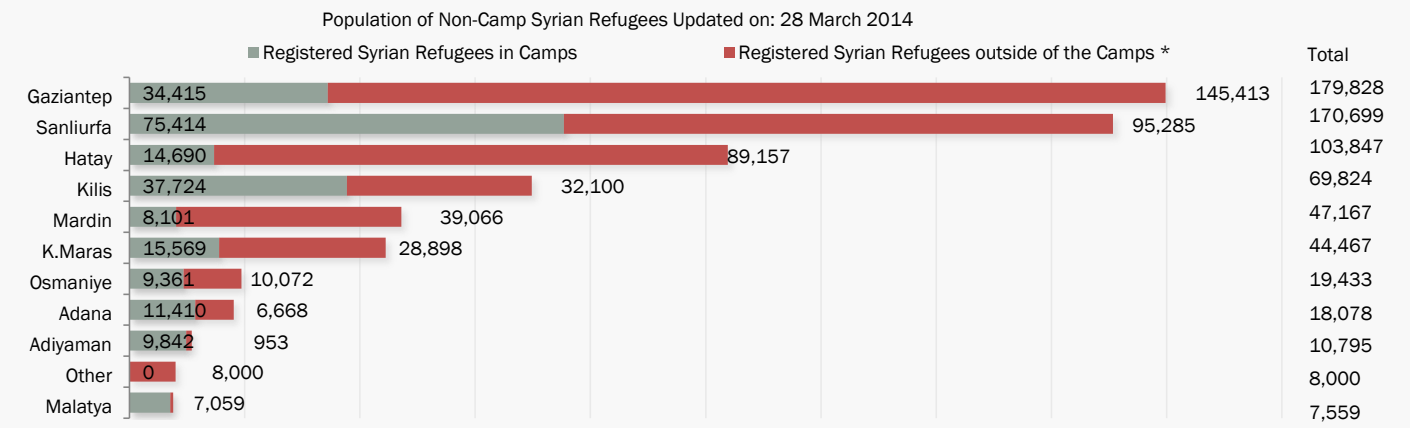
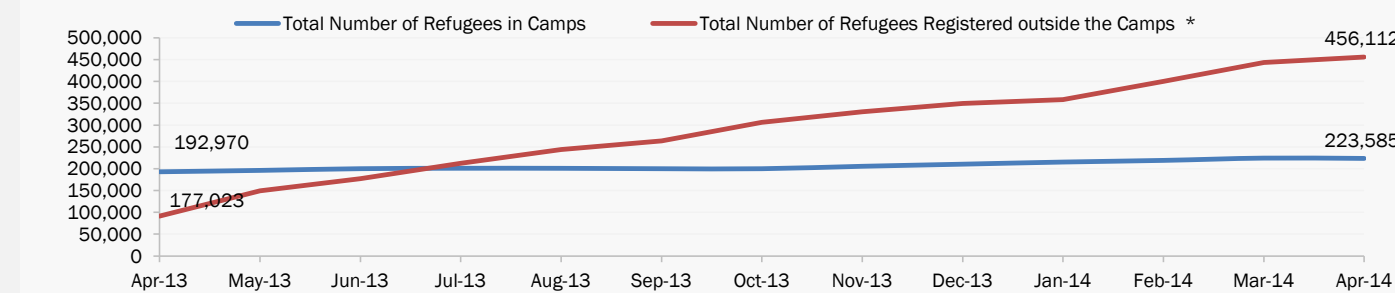

Highlights

- On 09 April 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 223,585. AFAD reported that during the period of 08-09 April 2014, a total of 227 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 373 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The AFAD Gaziantep Provincial Director informed UNHCR that the second mobile coordination center in Gaziantep has been sent to Nizip. As of early this week they have started to register out of camp Syrians in Nizip, using the new registration software with integrated digital finger prints. As of end last week the AFAD Coordination Center in Nizip had registered more than 19,000 persons, who will be re-registered in the new database.
- As of this week, two Mobile Coordination Centers are operational in Gaziantep province and in total 9 Mobile Coordination Centers of 12 sent to the field are operational and the registration of non-camp Syrians is taking place in 6 Provinces. The Center in Batman and the second Center in Sanliurfa are expected to be operational within the coming week.
- In Kilis, the NGO Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) has a Center providing Psycho-social counseling to trauma cases. All staff members are Syrian nationals except the manager. Among the mental health professionals (psychologist, psychiatrist, social workers etc.), some are specifically specialized/ experienced in the treatment of war trauma. The centre receives around 6-7 patients on a daily basis. If needed medicines are prescribed by the psychiatrist and provided free of charge by OIC. OIC also operates in Kilis Elbeyli camp on a weekly basis.
- In Adiyaman, the camp management informed UNHCR that the school which was planned for urban refugees is proposed to be moved to the camp due to very low number of children registered outside of the camp. In Adiyaman Camp, there are about 3,300 children attending the camp school, which is about 35% of the camp population. Another 1,000 adults or more are attending to vocational courses.
