



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	<b>679,697</b>

## Highlights

- On 09 April 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 223,585. AFAD reported that during the period of 08-09 April 2014, a total of 227 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 373 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria. No new numbers were received from AFAD since 09 April 2014
- Local authorities in Hatay informed that the registration of non-camp Syrians is on-going in all 12 towns of Hatay province including Antakya city center. According to the official numbers as of 08 April 2014, the total number of registered non-camp Syrians in Hatay is 118,436 persons of which about 76% are in 4 towns (Antakya- 24%, Reyhanli-26%, Kirikhan-16% and Iskenderun-10%). The two border towns Altinozu and Yayladagi where 5 camps exist hosts about 11-12% of the non-camp refugees.
- UNHCR Field teams are informed that in all the camps, the camp managements together with the refugees committees (Women Committee, Youth Committee and Children Committee) are preparing activities for the Children Festival on 23rd of April. Provincial Director of Gaziantep AFAD informed that they are also planning for participation of Syrian children from all camps to the celebrations in Gaziantep. 10 children (5 boys and 5 girls) from all the camps are invited to be in Gaziantep for a week to participate the celebration program.
- In Kilis state hospital officials informed UNHCR team that they are having about 300 Syrian patients per day which significantly stretches the response capacity of the hospital. The officials stated that when there is fighting across the border, it is more challenging as they receive all the wounded people and have to provide immediate response. In some cases they have to refer them to other provinces, Gaziantep etc.
- UNHCR is informed by provincial director of AFAD in Bursa that the number of non-camp Syrians living in Bursa province is estimated to be around 20,000. According to the officials some 5,000 Syrians are registered with police while some have passports and were provided an ikamet (temporary residence permit).
