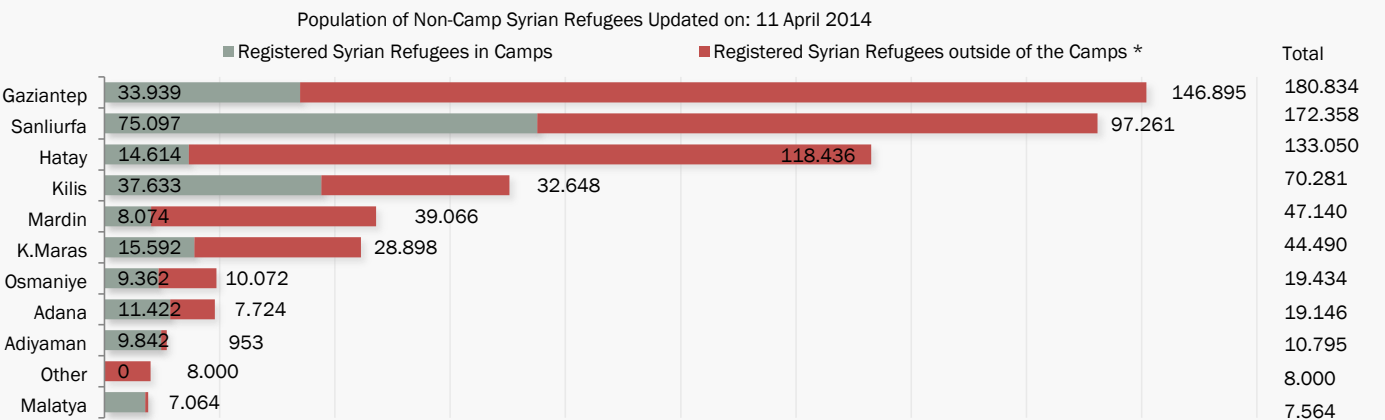
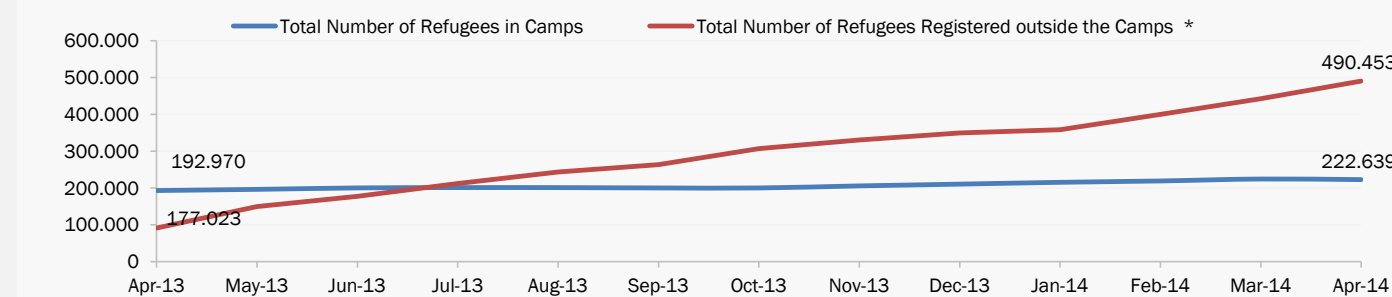

Highlights

- On 14 April 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 222,639. AFAD reported that during the period of 13-14 April 2014, a total of 86 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 359 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The local authorities in Senyurt border crossing point in Kiziltepe/Mardin informed that that they continue to facilitate the crossing of spontaneous returns and reportedly about 400 persons are crossing to Syria on a daily basis. The officials informed that during the last 3 months of 2013 (Oct-Nov-Dec) about 50,000 persons' crossing to Syria was facilitated; however it is not known how many of them are multiple returns.
- In Kilis, the local authorities informed that some 64 vulnerable women and children were identified in Bab Al Salame IDP camp, whose immediate male family members (husbands, fathers, brothers) were killed and who will be admitted to Elbeyli camp. The camp officials are trying to arrange space in the camp by putting together smaller families of 1-2 persons to allocate space.
- In Kilis Oncupinar camp, the officials informed UNHCR that they have received about 120 wheel chairs from a Germany based NGO. The camp officials distributed 62 of them immediately to those who are in need and the rest were kept in the warehouse to be used when needed. The NGO also informed the officials that they will continue to provide additional support based on the needs.
- In Nusaybin camp, the officials informed that they have received about 49 vulnerable persons living in Nusaybin town who were registered and settled in the camp. The camp officials also informed UNHCR that they have received 53 Syrians from Nizip camp on 14 April 2014 evening. Reportedly they are some of those who were sent last week but refused to stay in Nusaybin and came back to Nizip again. As they were not re-admitted to Nizip camp, officials offered them Nusaybin again and they agreed to go back.
