

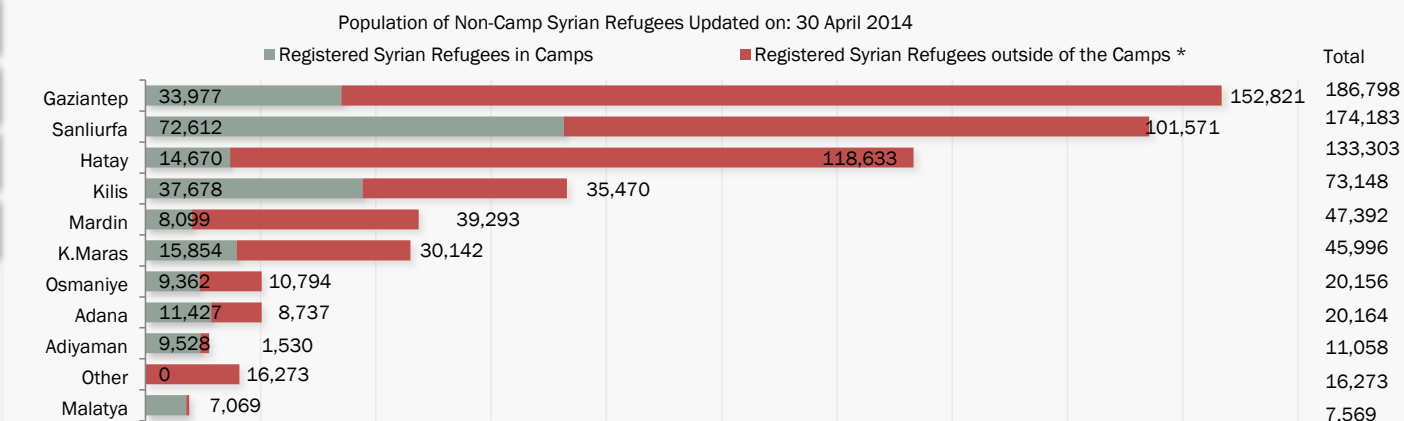

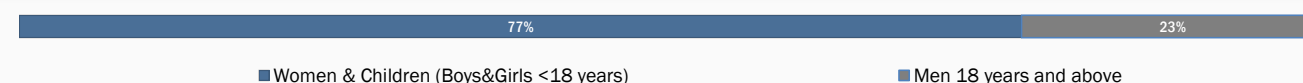

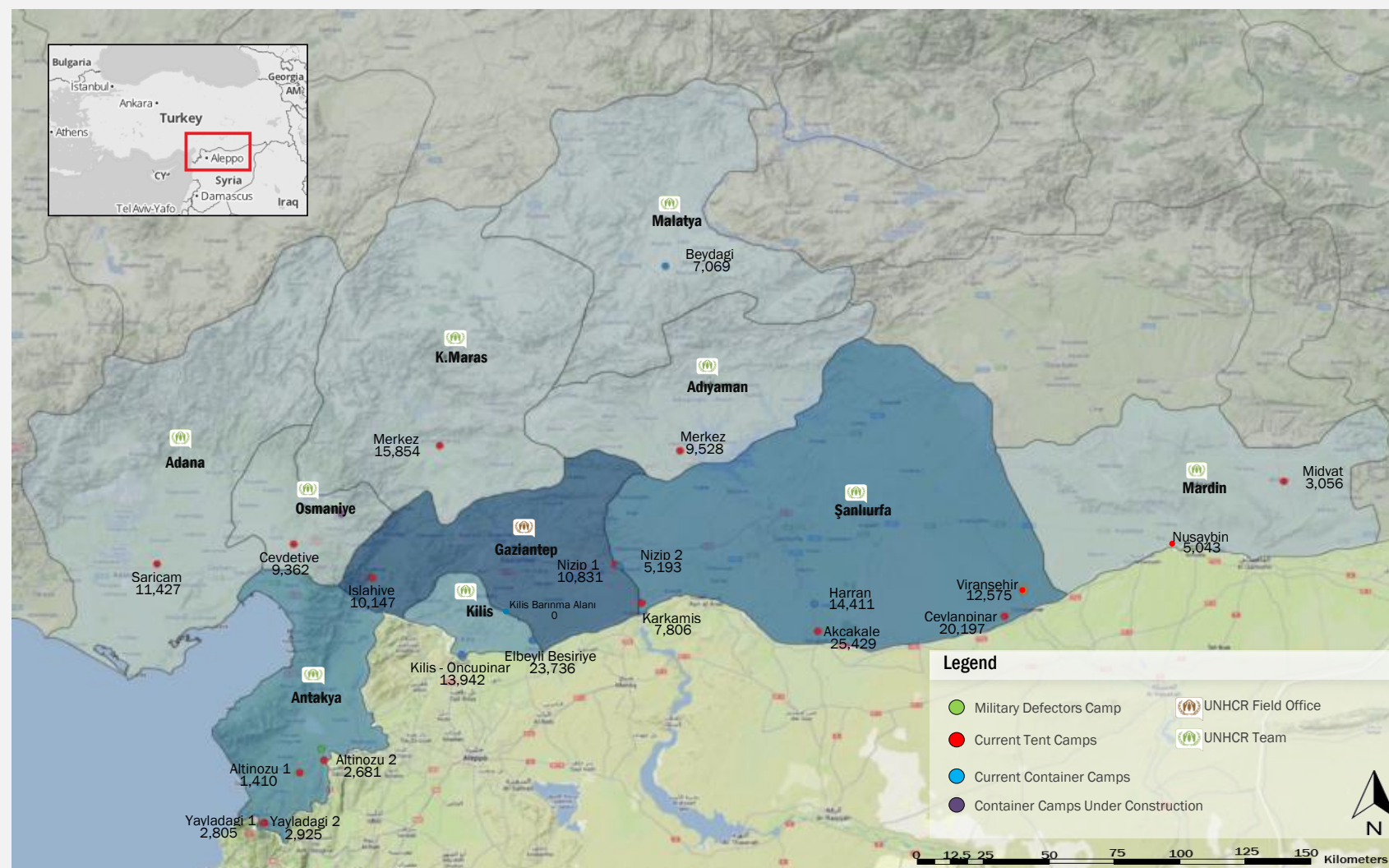


## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- On 05 May 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220,276. AFAD reported that during the period of 04-05 May 2014, a total of 365 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 213 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Adana, with the ongoing registration of non-camp Syrians in the Mobile Coordination Center, officials informed that they have so far registered 3,879 non-camp Syrians there. The officials informed that they have already given appointments to about 18,000 non-camp Syrians to be registered until the end of Dec 2014. Reportedly about 100-150 persons are given appointments per day.
- The spontaneous arrivals continue to be one of the major challenges to the camps. Despite the efforts of the camp officials to transfer them to other camps (Nusaybin or Viransehir), while admitting only some families to the camps depending on the availability of tents, there are still about 350-400 people temporarily accommodated in the waiting areas of Nizip-1 (33 people), Karkamis (220-230 people), Islahiye (about 60-80 people), Adiyaman (about 40-50 people). The camp officials informed that the numbers are changing as sometimes people leave the area without informing the camp management.
- The camp management in Nusaybin informed that during the previous week, they have received about 70 people who were admitted and accommodated in the camp. Reportedly 33 people were transferred from Kahramanmaraş, 14 people were transferred from Malatya and Midyat, while more than 30 people approached the camp spontaneously and claimed to be new arrivals. The camp officials reported that the majority of the new arrivals (about 25) were women and children.
- In Akcakale, the camp officials informed that upon request from the NGO - Deniz Feneri, they will identify about 100 students (50 girls and 50 boys) based on their success in the school who will be taken to Istanbul for a tour. Reportedly the NGO Deniz Feneri will cover their costs and accommodation in Istanbul during the period of 21-27 June 2014.
