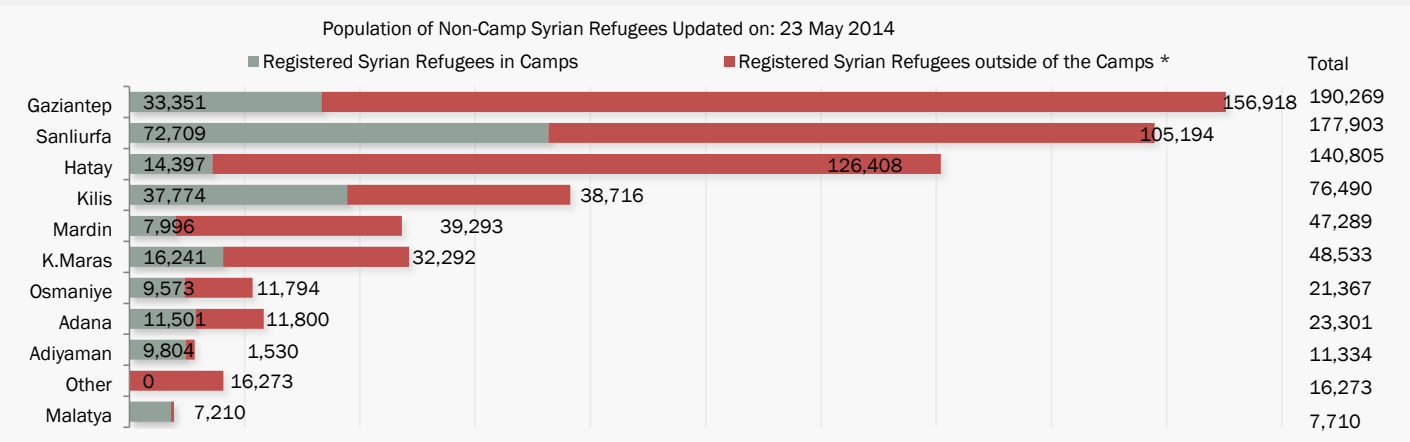
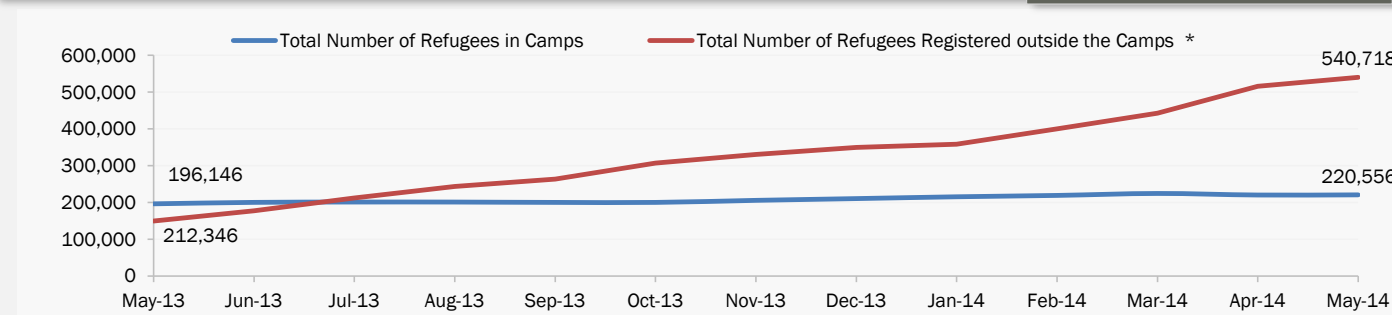

Highlights

- On 28 May 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 220,556. AFAD reported that during the period of 27-28 May 2014 a total of 566 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 498 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Viransehir town, local officials informed UNHCR that, through Social Assistance and Solidarity (SASF), they have provided about 2,500 food packages to non-camp Syrian families living in Viransehir town, assisting a total of approximately 7,000 Syrians. The food packages were reportedly distributed based on family size, so some bigger families received more than one food package.
- Local officials in Gaziantep informed UNHCR that the number of Syrians in Gaziantep province is estimated to be about 200,000, with 33,000 Syrians accommodated in 4 camps, and the rest staying in urban areas (the majority of non-camp Syrians are in Gaziantep city center and Nizip town). While registration is still ongoing in Gaziantep city center and in Nizip and Islahiye towns, it is estimated that almost one quarter of the estimated number of Syrians in Turkey are living in Gaziantep.
- With close advocacy of UNHCR in the field and at central level for two unaccompanied minor girls in Ceylanpinar camp, camp offiUNHCR that they received instructions from the provincial office of Ministry of Family and Social Policies that the children will be moved out of the camp and placed in one of the Ministry's child protection centers.
- In Harran camp, officials informed UNHCR that they have organized a solidarity event where Syrian women from the camp cooked local food with the support of the wives of the local officials (governor, sub-governors and mayors), and raised about 3,000 to 5,000 TL that will be sent to Soma town as donation to show the solidarity of the Syrian refugee community with the families of the victims of the mining incident there earlier this year.
