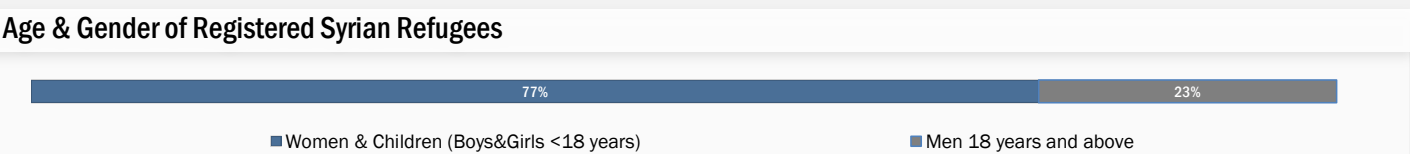
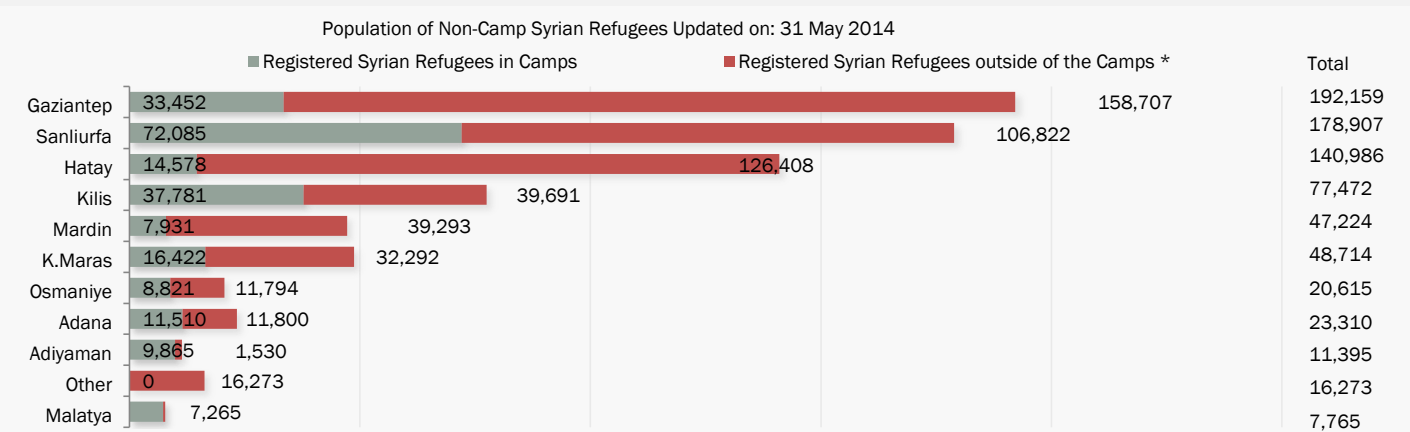
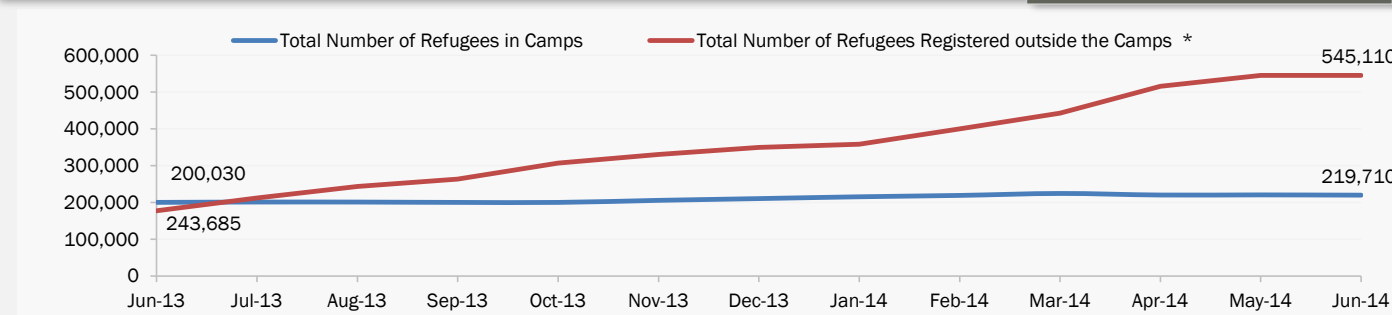

Highlights

- On 04 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,710. AFAD reported that during the period of 03-04 June 2014, a total of 140 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 433 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Kilis, officials informed UNHCR that the number of registered non-camp Syrians has reached almost 39,000. The police reported that they have conducted approximately 105 house visits in some 63 locations in the town. According to the police, only 12 out of the 106 families visited requested to be placed in a camp, while 32 families stated they do not want to be moved to any of the camps and 62 families stated that they don't want to leave Kilis center at all, due to the proximity of Kilis to their place of origin (Aleppo etc.).
- In Yayladagi camp in Hatay, officials informed UNHCR that the camps hosts 68 students who applied to universities in other cities (Mersin, Isparta and Balikesir) and have been requested to pay an application fee. It is reported that, through the initiatives of sub-governor, the students were exempted from application fees and they have registered for entrance exams.
- In Viransehir camp, officials informed UNHCR that the Palestinian Ambassador visited the camp and distributed 100 USD per person to each Palestinian refugee in the camp. Reportedly, there are about 80 persons of Palestinian origin registered in the camp, the majority of whom are single males, while there are also some families.
- In Ceylanpinar camp, the officials reported that new-arrivals continue to approach the camp requesting to be admitted. Officials stated that during the last three days they have admitted about 20 families and registered them in the camp. Camp officials also informed UNHCR that they have identified about 20 persons with special needs (PSN) whom they are intending to accommodate in containers that are expected to be delivered to the camp soon.
