


Highlights

- On 05 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,688. AFAD reported that during the period of 04-05 June 2014, a total of 311 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and that 333 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Viransehir camp, officials informed UNHCR that they have received the first group of Syrians (about 344 persons) who had been temporarily accommodated in a guesthouse in the Tuzla district of Istanbul. Camp officials informed UNHCR that, according to an instruction letter from AFAD Hq., a total of approximately 661 Syrians will be transferred from Istanbul to Viransehir camp. The first group arrived in the camp on 05 June 2014 and was admitted and registered in the camp.
- In Nizip-1 and 2 camps, local officials informed UNHCR that they are working on installing a water purification system to clean the water from the lake situated next to both camps. It is reported that this will increase the water capacity of the camps and should solve the occasionally-reported water shortage problems for camp residents.
- In Sanliurfa, officials of the Ministry of Family and Social Policies informed UNHCR that they are planning to establish a separate shelter with the capacity for 40 children in the city center for unaccompanied minor children under 12 years old. Officials stated that the project will be supported by AFAD and the Religious Affairs Foundation together with relevant line ministries (Ministry of Education and Ministry of Youth and Sports). Officials informed UNHCR that unaccompanied children over 12 years old will be accommodated in shelters that are being established in some of the camps.
- In Kilis, a school that was built by UNICEF has been completed and was handed over to local authorities. The school has 12 classrooms and will serve non-camp Syrians. It is reported that the school will be kept open during the summer holiday and compensation classes will be provided to children who need them to prepare for the next semester.
