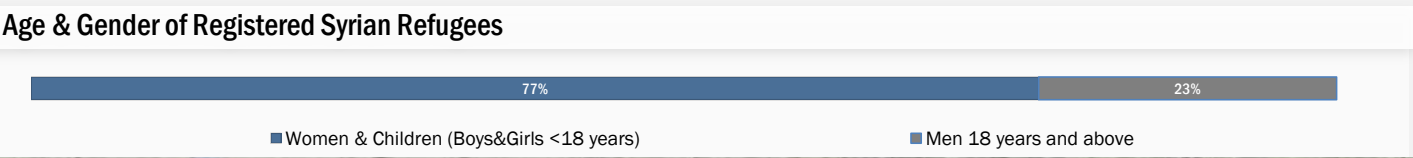
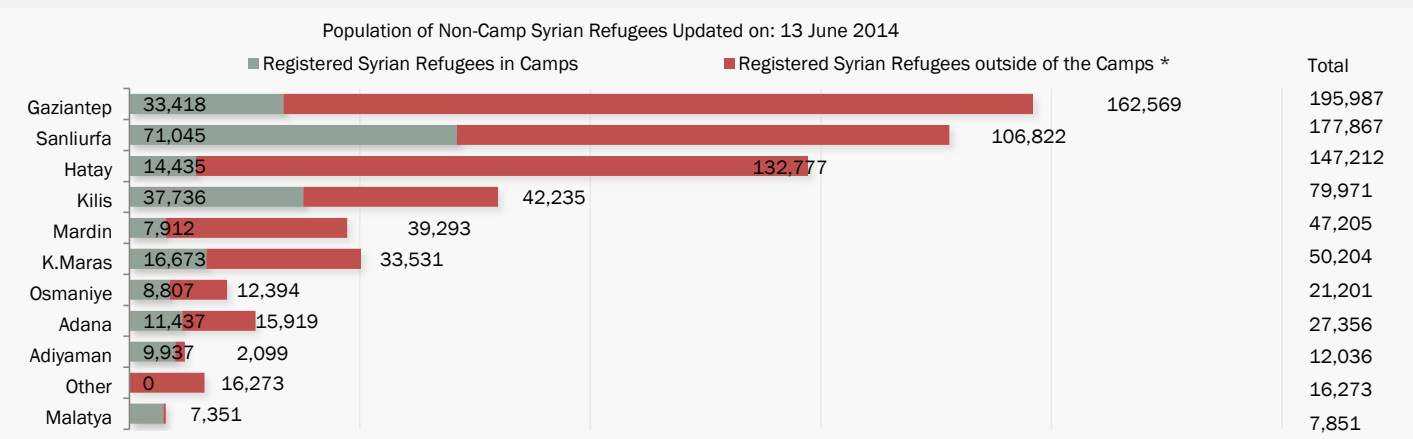
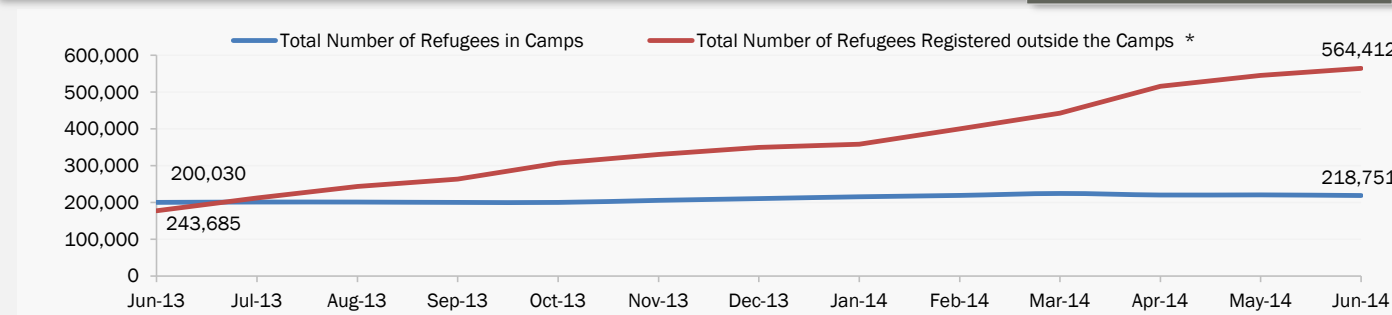

Highlights

- On 15 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,751. AFAD reported that during the period of 13-15 June 2014, a total of 292 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 708 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Camp officials informed UNHCR that people requesting to be admitted to the camps continues to be one of their main challenges. In Ceylanpinar camp, officials stated that they try to admit new arrivals to the camp by rearranging multiple tents that are used by one family. Camp officials stated that in some days they managed to admit 4-5 families. In Adiyaman camp, officials reported that they still have about 75 people in the camp waiting area and that they have been waiting for confirmation from AFAD Ankara to transfer these Syrians to another camp (presumably to Nusaybin camp).
- In Karkamis, the camp management informed UNHCR that they have identified about 400 Syrians in the camp who were originally admitted to the camp as guests to stay with their relatives for a few days who subsequently did not leave the camp. The camp management informed UNHCR that they have decided not to admit any guests to the residential area of the camp anymore. The residents can meet with visitors in the waiting area of the camp.
- Since the educational semester has ended in many camps, the education units in the camps are considering possible activities for the summer. In Karkamis, the camp management decided to award some 29 children who achieved the highest grades with awards from the local authorities, pens, clothes and toys. In Adiyaman, camp officials organized a charity bazaar in the city center of Adiyaman during the 13-15 June weekend, displaying items produced in the vocational courses in the camp. In Midyat camp, the education unit informed UNHCR that the teachers (14-F and 3-M) started to provide catch-up Arabic language (grammar, reading and writing) classes.
- In Karkamis, the camp officials informed UNHCR that they have established a price monitoring commission, with the participation of staff from AFAD, Camp management, Kizilay, WFP and a Syrian mukhtar, to monitor prices in the supermarket in the camp.
