


Highlights

- On 17 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,998. AFAD reported that during the period of 16-17 June 2014, a total of 72 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 236 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- UNHCR Field team met with officials in Birecik town of Sanliurfa, who informed UNHCR that they have already registered 6,000 non-camp Syrians living in Birecik and that they continue to register Syrians. Reportedly, non-camp Syrians are registered by SASF (Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundation) in the AFAD software and then referred to the police for fingerprinting. The Health Directorate officials stated that from the beginning of 2014 until mid June, they have provided almost 6,000 outpatient/inpatient medical services to Syrians living in Birecik, with almost 22% of these services provided during the month of May 2014.
- The camp management in Midyat informed UNHCR that they have procured about 200 fans and have started to distribute these to families who are spending their first summer in the camp (the other families were provided with fans last summer). However, officials are considering increasing the number of fans procured, anticipating possibility of broken fans that will need to be replaced.
- Officials in Midyat camp have also started to distribute the hygiene kits they received from UNFPA and the German Red Cross through Kizilay. Camp officials stated that they are providing 1-2 hygiene kit packages to each family, depending on family size. Families of up to five persons are given one package and bigger families are provided with two packages.
- Local officials also informed UNHCR that the SASF office in the sub-governorate received additional funding from Ankara and will start to provide 50 TL cash assistance per person to the Syrians living in Midyat. Officials are aiming to provide cash assistance to up to 4,000 persons, presumably about 800-1,000 vulnerable families.
