

Highlights

- On 18 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,632. AFAD reported that during the period of 17-18 June 2014, a total of 21 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 387 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Adiyaman camp, the officials informed UNHCR that they have admitted and accommodated about 22 persons with vulnerabilities from a group of Syrians in the waiting area of the camp. These 22 persons have been accommodated in tents that recently became available due to people leaving the camp and not returning. Camp officials reported that there are still about 70 persons in the waiting area and they will try to admit them as well after the departure of a group of 66 people, who have requested voluntary return to Syria.
- In Viransehir camp, a UNHCR Field team was informed that the camp management will not admit guests to the residential area of the camp anymore, since previous guests had refused to leave after their visits. The camp residents are allowed to meet with their relatives in the waiting area of the camp. Additionally, there are reportedly some 20-25 Syrians in the waiting area claiming to be new arrivals who have been advised to approach local authorities to be referred to the camp through official channels.
- In Urfa province, a UNHCR field team visited a school that is supported by the governorate. The school teachers informed UNHCR that, since the educational semester has already finished, they have started English language classes for Syrians in the 14-20 age group. The teachers are reportedly 12 Arab-origin US citizens who have volunteered to teach at the school with the support of an International NGO.
- In Urfa, IMPR informed UNHCR that they have started a cash assistance program as of 16 June in collaboration with WHH. IMPR reported that they have established field teams and identified about 8,500 vulnerable persons in Kiziltepe (5,000 persons) and Ceylanpinar (3,500 persons). IMPR informed that the persons will be provided 40 TL per person as cash assistance.
