


Highlights

- On 22 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,352. AFAD reported that during the period of 20-22 June 2014, a total of 877 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,178 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- According to the official figures reported by AFAD, almost half a million (497,286) Syrians have been registered and accommodated in the camps since the beginning of the crisis, however 56% of those individuals have been de-registered from the camp records for various reasons. Some reportedly returned to Syria voluntarily and/or took permission to leave but never reported back. According to the official numbers reported by AFAD, while there has been a 3,8 % increase in the camp's population since end of Dec. 2013, there has also been a decrease of 2,6% since end of March 2014.
- Local authorities in Gaziantep informed UNHCR that the cost of the Syrian refugees in the camps in Turkey is between 6.8 TL and 15.5 TL per person per day. According to the officials in Gaziantep, the cost per person per day in the four camps in Gaziantep province is between 7.8 TL and 10.4 TL per person per day, with a lower average cost per person in the Gaziantep camps than in the other camps.
- AFAD reported that, as of 22 June 2014, almost 3 million inpatient/outpatient services have been provided to Syrians in Turkey since the beginning of the crisis. This reportedly includes more than 50 thousand surgeries. It is also reported that 13,300 Syrian children have been born in Turkey since the beginning of the crisis. In Gaziantep alone, the officials stated that so far they have paid about 45 million TL for medical treatment and 2 million TL for medicine. Officials reported that the monthly medical cost of the Syrians in Gaziantep is about 4 million TL.
- Gaziantep local authorities also reported that among the non-camp Syrians in Gaziantep province about 23% are at school age (05-17 years) and that despite all the support from local authorities, UN Agencies, and I/NGOs, only 25% of the school-age children have access to education because of capacity shortages in schools.
