


Highlights

- On 23 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,202. AFAD reported that during the period of 22-23 June 2014, a total of 114 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps, and 264 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Last weekend, media reported that a group of approximately 80 Syrians who had been living in an abandoned building that had formerly been used as a prison in Akcakale town were approached by local officials to be moved to Akcakale camp, however they refused to leave. A UNHCR team is following up regarding the situation with both the refugees and the camp management.
- In Kilis, a UNHCR field team met with a group of Palestinians from Syria who have been living a warehouse reportedly arranged for by the Palestinian Community in Turkey. The group leader informed that there are about 23 families (approx. 150 persons) living there and that their expenses are covered by the Palestinian Community. It was observed by UNHCR that the warehouse is divided by partitions to provide privacy for the families and another section is reserved for the single males. A separate section is reserved as a kitchen and volunteers in the group cook for all the people. The UNHCR team advised the group to register with the authorities as soon as possible in order to have access to services such as health assistance.
- In Adana, while the registration of non-camp Syrians continues in the mobile registration center in the city center, officials also continue to register non-camp Syrians in the registration facilities in the camp as well to decrease the workload of the registration center in the city. Local authorities provide transportation from city center to the camp twice a day for in-camp registration - once in the morning and once in the afternoon.
- The mobile coordination center which was in use in Islahiye town moved to the city center of Gaziantep (Sahinbey district) last week and has started to register non-camp Syrians there. Officials stated that this will reduce the burden of the current registration center in the town. As of the end of last week, it was reported that 546 persons (112 families) have been registered and that these numbers are included in the total non-camp Syrians in Gaziantep province.
