


## Highlights

- On 25 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,561. AFAD reported that during the period of 24-25 June 2014, a total of 126 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 61 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Nizip-2 camp, officials organized a diploma ceremony for the Syrians who completed the Turkish Language course provided by TOMER (Turkish Language Teaching Center of Ankara University). Officials informed UNHCR that 833 students participated to the course throughout Turkey and that 404 of them passed the proficiency exam. Among the participants in the camps, Osmaniye camp reportedly had a success rate of 83%, the highest in the country. UNHCR field teams were informed that the camp managements are planning to organize supplementary courses during the summer and will use the same TOMER curriculum to prepare the students for the next exam.
- In Adiyaman camp, officials informed UNHCR that they organized a charity bazaar in town where Syrian refugees sold their local food. During the bazaar, refugees had the opportunity to market and sell their products produced in vocational courses in the camp. Reportedly 2,600 TL was raised from the food that was brought by NGOs and locals. The camp management will decide with the refugees how to use the proceeds to benefit of the whole camp.
- In Akcakale camp, the IMC-supported rehabilitation center with 5 staff (4 physiotherapist and 1 rehabilitation staff) is providing support to new arrivals. In addition, the staff also provide support to other camp residents in the mornings until noon and then again in the afternoons.
- In Reyhanli, local authorities informed UNHCR that they have provided various types of assistance to the non-camp Syrians in Reyhanli through SASF (Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundation). Reportedly, since the beginning of the crisis, 6150 food packages have been provided, 2,216 households have been provided with 1/2 ton of coal, and 1,200 stoves and 3,500 blankets have been distributed to families during the winter months. Additionally, 6,600 households have been provided with clothes, and 1,771 persons have received cash assistance.
