



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	<b>789,750</b>

## Highlights

- On 26 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,633. AFAD reported that during the period of 25-26 June 2014, a total of 398 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 326 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Nizip-1 camp, officials informed UNHCR that the 50 persons who were reported last week as being temporarily accommodated in the camp waiting area have all been admitted and registered in the camp. Camp officials reported that these people were referred to the camp on the instruction of local authorities through the religious affairs office in town.
- In Kilis, Elbeyli camp officials informed UNHCR that they have identified some families who were registered in the camp but have been away for a while and have not been using their containers. The camp management has so far identified 4 unused containers and indicated that they will conduct a general survey to assess the situation. If more empty containers are found, all those individuals will be deregistered from the camp records and the containers will be allocated to new arrivals.
- In Karkamis camp, UNHCR was informed that there are about 35 Syrians who are accommodated in a mosque in the nearby village. The group was reportedly assisted by the local people in the village and they were provided with bags of 25 kg of flour. This triggered some camp residents to approach the village community, who gave them bags of flour as well.
- In Ceylanpinar, camp officials informed UNHCR that they received about 600 packages containing various types of dry food from a German faith-based NGO. The camp management wants to use the packages for new arrivals until their food cards are issued, as well as for those whose food cards need to be renewed.
- In Nizip-1 Camp, officials informed UNHCR that they have a new female social worker assigned to the camp. The camp officials reported that they have allocated a tent to be used as a "women friendly space" in the camp. With the new female social worker, the camp management will discuss with the women in the camp what types of activities will be
