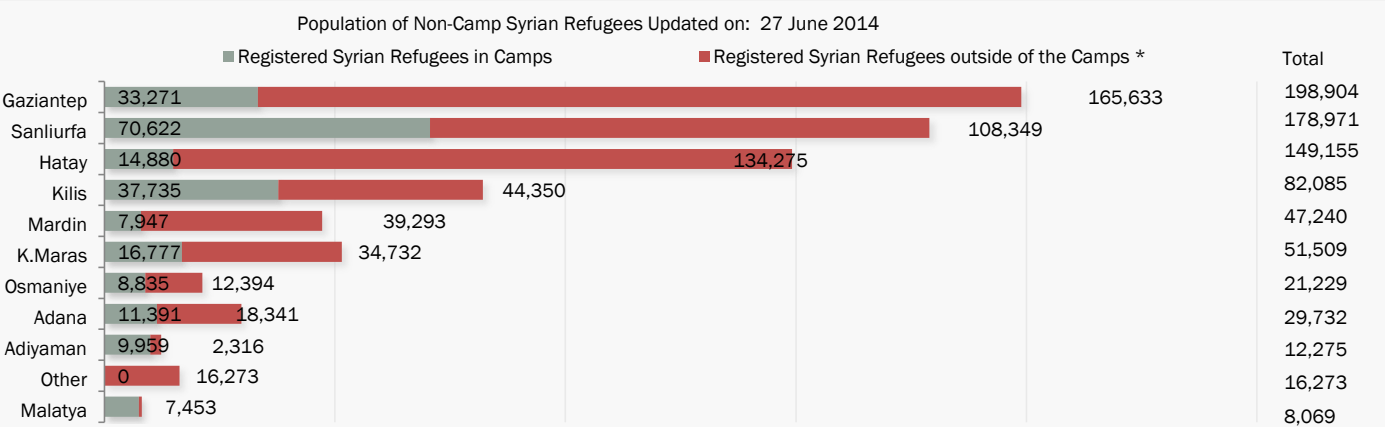
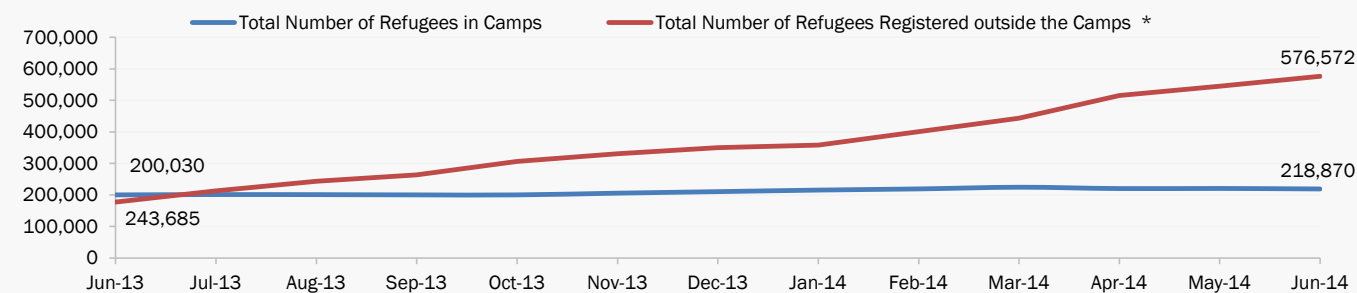
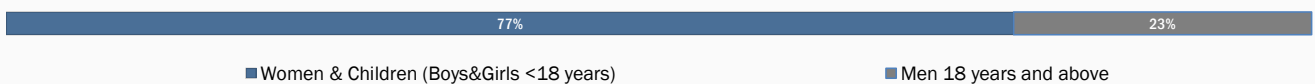


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	795,442

Highlights

- On 30 June 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,870. AFAD reported that during the period of 29-30 June 2014, a total of 114 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 196 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Ceylanpinar camp, Turkish Red Crescent (TRC) staff informed UNHCR that the municipality of Ceylanpinar town is considering providing assistance to non-camp Syrians in the town. TRC staff were requested to provide the number of vulnerable non-camp Syrian families and their conditions to be provided with food packages. Reportedly, Social Assistance and Solidarity Fund (SASF) of Ceylanpinar also requested additional funding from the government to provide assistance to non-camp Syrians during the month of Ramadan and Eid al-fitr.
- The officials in Ceylanpinar also informed UNHCR that an INGO called Welt Hunger Hilfe (WHH) will start to provide food packages to some 1,100 non-camp Syrians living in Ceylanpinar as of the first week of July. WHH is also considering starting a nine-month cash assistance program for some 1,700 non-camp Syrian families living in Ceylanpinar and Kiziltepe towns. TRC Ceylanpinar reported that the main needs in the town are hygiene kits, baby formula and baby diapers.
- In Nusaybin camp, officials informed UNHCR that TRC (Turkish Red Crescent) will provide 4,600 pillows, 1,500 mattresses, 1,000 kitchen sets, 1,000 hygiene kits, and one truck full of clothes to the camp.
- Officials of Nusaybin camp also indicated that they will continue Turkish language classes during the summer period. Camp officials stated that have opened three classes (1 for women and 2 for men) and some 120 persons have been enrolled to the courses. In addition, the officials stated that they have started to give pedagogical training to the teachers who are not teachers by profession. The training will be for 2 days per week and will continue during the month of Ramadan.
