
Key Statistics

- Lebanon hosts 38% of Syrian refugees in the region – more than any other country.
- 1 in 5 residents is a refugee, and refugees live in some 1,700 locations throughout the country.
- 53% of refugees are children.
- Approximately 86% of refugees live in localities with the highest concentration of Lebanese living in poverty.
- At least 40% live in substandard shelters (unfinished buildings, worksites, garages) and informal settlements.
- Cost of Syrian crisis to Lebanon: USD 7.5 billion by end 2014 (World Bank/UN - ESIA).

RRP6 Mid-Year Achievements

- 247,892 Syrian refugees have been registered, and 1,703 PRS have been recorded allowing refugees to access protection services.
- 106,752 persons benefited from improvements to insecure dwellings and were able to survive the winter.
- 250,000 were assisted with shelter in the form of renovation, rehabilitation, emergency cash for temporary shelter and cash for rent.
- Syrian refugees and vulnerable Lebanese redeemed more than USD 101 million in the form of e-cards and vouchers for food.
- 395,000 primary health care consultations at public and mobile health clinics allowed refugees and vulnerable Lebanese to access basic treatment and preventive health care.
- 140,000 children were enrolled in formal education and 65,000 children participated in non-formal learning programmes. Tens of thousands of children received psycho-social support instrumental to coping with their new challenging lives.
- 150 community support projects, such as garbage trucks, septic tanks and rehabilitation of schools, implemented to alleviate pressure on service delivery and reduce social tensions.

RRP6 Priorities

Life-saving or preventing immediate risk of harm

- Newcomers receive immediate core relief items and food.
- Prioritized identification of vulnerable cases for immediate referral to the appropriate service provider.
- Food assistance provided to 75% of refugees and vulnerable Lebanese.
- Life-saving health interventions, such as secondary healthcare for obstetrics.
- Refugees receive assistance to protect their shelters from harsh weather conditions.

Preventing deterioration of vulnerabilities

- Older persons, persons with disabilities and other groups at risk are thoroughly assisted.
- Persons who risk resorting to harmful behaviour (e.g., survival sex, early marriage and child labour) to survive are supported.
- Refugee volunteers and community focal points are mobilized to promote the services available to refugees and poor Lebanese.


Strengthening capacity and resilience among refugees and host communities

- Public systems and infrastructure are strengthened.
- More permanent income generating and peace building opportunities are made available to vulnerable individuals.
