



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	799,291

Highlights

- On 06 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,061. AFAD reported that during the period of 04-06 July 2014, a total of 1,084 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,375 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Nizip town, a UNHCR-funded health facility is still under construction, with construction expected to be completed by mid-July 2014. In Nizip town, in addition to the medical assistance provided in the state hospital, the International Medical Corps (IMC) is also providing health assistance to non-camp Syrians living in Nizip town (about 70%) as well as some camp residents (about 30%) who approach the clinic for assistance.
- The Danish Refugee Council (DRC) informed UNHCR that they are starting a series of Community Initiated Projects in Hatay and Sanliurfa provinces. Reportedly, five small-scale activities by Syrians and the local community will take place in Hatay province in Antakya, Altinozu, Narlica and Kumlu towns, and 10 will be held in Sanliurfa province. The aim of these activities is to bring together the Syrians and locals living in the same districts and to raise awareness. One of the activities will be organizing art and music workshops for Syrian and Turkish children.
- In Midyat camp, officials reported that they have received food packages from private donors and will distribute one package per family in the camp, and that another donor is providing one watermelon per family each week during the month of Ramadan. The camp has also received clothing for children between 0-18 years of age, 500 pairs of shoes for adults and some fabric which camp management will give to women to make their own clothing in the vocational courses offered in the camp.
- In Nizip town, the construction of a prefabricated school with 12 classrooms, funded by UNICEF has been completed. Officials informed UNHCR that teachers will be assigned to the school by the Directorate of Ministry of National Education and that the school will be functional during the next educational year.
