



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	799,468

Highlights

- On 07 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,238. AFAD reported that during the period of 06-07 July 2014, a total of 430 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 253 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Nusaybin camp, officials informed UNHCR that they received 26 Syrians from Adiyaman, 17 Syrians from Ceylanpinar and 12 Syrians from urban Siirt as per instruction from AFAD. In Ceylanpinar, officials reported that they have identified about 50 Syrians living in parks and on streets in the town to be transferred to the camp, however only 17 of the identified persons presented themselves on the day the transfer was scheduled.
- In Nusaybin, camp officials informed that, with the initiative of local authorities and through local donations, they have distributed food packages to families in the camp in honor of the Ramadan. Each package is reportedly about 65kg and includes cereals, vegetable oil, sugar and tomato paste.
- In Harran camp, officials informed UNHCR that they have prepared packages including clothes and basic NFIs (mattresses blankets, pillows) to be distributed to the 15 Syrians newly arrived in Harran town.
- In Hassa town of Hatay, officials informed UNHCR that they have registered over 5,000 Syrians living outside of the camps and they are still registering people. However, since the number of applications has reduced considerably, they are registering only one day per week and about 50 people apply for registration. The officials reported that they are also providing shuttle transportation for those living in the villages of Hassa who want to come for registration.
- In Kumlu town of Hatay, local officials informed a UNHCR team that they have stopped registration there since almost no one is approaching them for registration. The officials reported that about 2,400 non-camp Syrians have been registered in Kumlu and when new arrivals come to Kumlu they will now be diverted to Reyhanli for registration.
