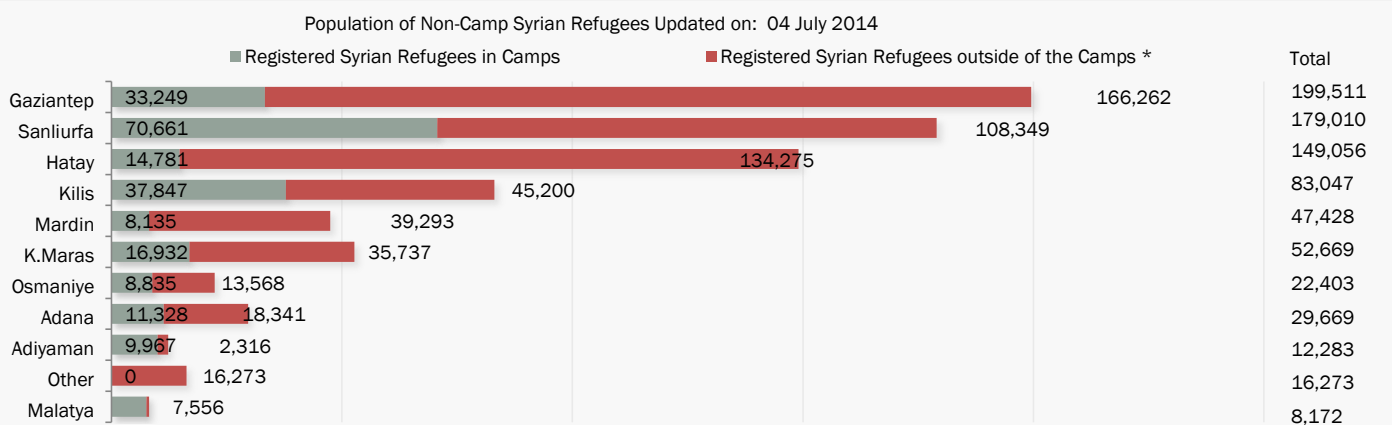
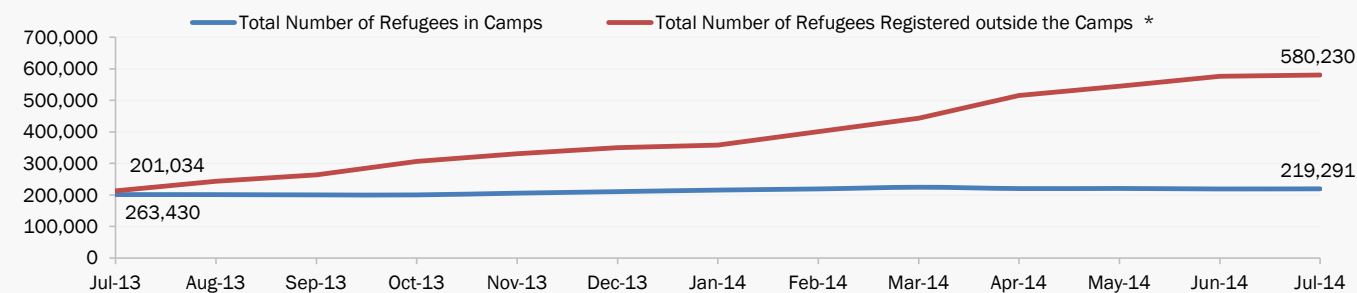
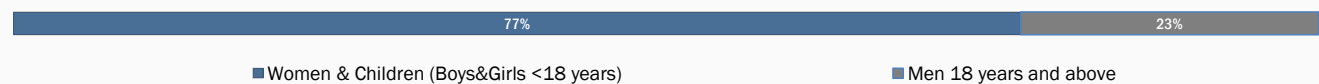


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	799,521

## Highlights

- On 08 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,291. AFAD reported that during the period of 07-08 July 2014, a total of 363 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 306 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Kilis, the local officials informed UNHCR that the Syrians of Palestinian origin living in Kilis town started to approach AFAD to be registered and that they were diverted to the mobile coordination centers for registration. The registration officials stated that they have already registered some 60 persons and the others were given appointments to be registered in the coming weeks. In the previous weeks a UNHCR team visited a warehouse where a group of Syrians of Palestinian origin were living, and they were encouraged by the UNHCR team to register with the authorities.
- In Nizip, officials reported that they have identified some 50 Syrian families (about 300 persons) who are living in the industrial area of the town and the authorities have offered to transfer them to a camp where space is available, however the families refuse to go to a camp. A UNHCR field team will follow up on the situation and meet with the families in order to understand their situation.
- In Viransehir camp, officials informed UNHCR that, in addition to those who are transferred to the camp under orders of AFAD Hq., they continue to admit new arrivals only if they have immediate family members in the camp, considering taking family unity. Camp officials stated that about 50-60 persons in such situations are admitted to the camp and registered on a weekly basis.
- A UNHCR Field Team in Sanliurfa together with camp officials is planning to organize a one-day activity project for the disabled children in Ceylanpinar camp. The project aims to raise awareness among the camp staff and camp residents, to sensitize their approach to these vulnerable children, and to create an environment of inclusion for these children in the daily social life of the camp. The activity will be in the form of a festival day and the winners of some games will be honored with small presents, and bed-ridden children will be visited in their tents
