



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	799,457

Highlights

- On 09 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,227. AFAD reported that during the period of 08-09 July 2014, a total of 443 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 507 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Adana, the local officials continue to register non-camp Syrians living in Adana province in the mobile coordination center provided by UNHCR. Local officials informed UNHCR that the number of non-camp Syrians registered as of the end of last week has reached about 13,500 persons. An official from MoNE (Ministry of National Education) is present during the registration process to identify the school-aged children and to inform families of education opportunities for Syrian children.
- In Adana, the Religious Affairs officials reported that one of their challenges is the non-camp Syrians living in mosques in the city. There are reportedly one to two Syrian families living in each mosque, making a total of about 186 Syrian families living in the mosques in Adana city center. One of the local NGOs in the city informed UNHCR that they have identified about 250 Syrian children in such situations, and they are working to identify up to 1,000 children for assistance.
- In Iskenderun town of Hatay, the local officials informed UNHCR that they have registered more than 15,000 Syrians living in the town. Officials reported that, although they have registered almost all the Syrians living in the town, occasionally they receive more applications which they continue to register. The local officials also stated that when they started the registration, they organized teams to work in shifts with support staff from religious affairs office as interpreters and that they have provided transportation to bring Syrians for registration.
- In Sanliurfa, the International Blue Crescent opened four child friendly spaces in four different locations in the city center. The project is funded by UNHCR. The International Blue Crescent informed UNHCR that there are about 36 staff (8 team leaders and 28 animators) working in the centers. They have registered about 400 Syrian children so far, however that
