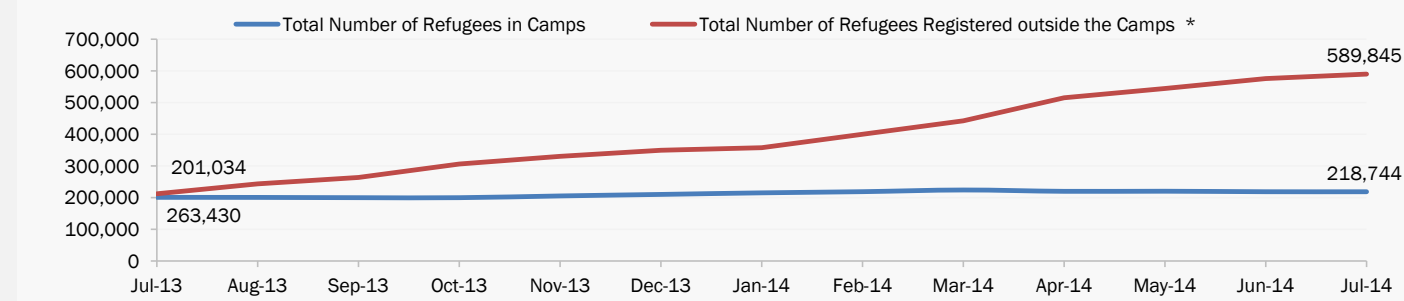


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	808,589

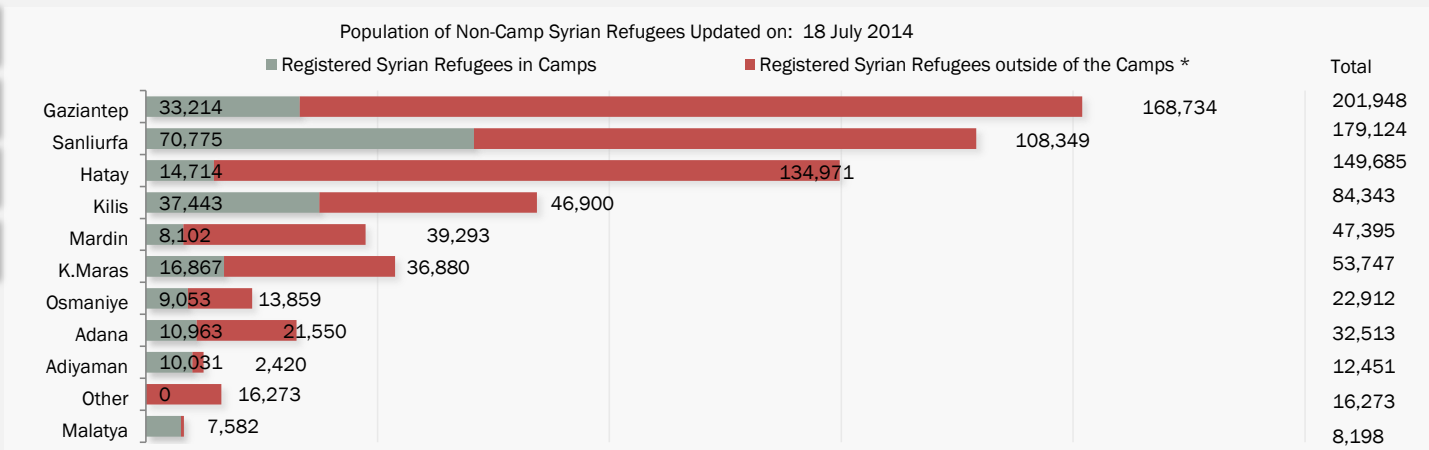
Highlights

- On 22 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,744. AFAD reported that during the period of 21-22 July 2014, a total of 267 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 289 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- Provincial AFAD Directorate in Batman informed UNHCR that as of this week, the police have started to register the non-camp Syrians living in Batman province in the mobile coordination center provided by UNHCR. With this last one in Batman, the number of mobile coordination center operational in the field registering non-camp Syrians increased to 10 out of 13 sent to 9 provinces. AFAD Batman informed that prior to the registration, they have enumerated approximately 16,000 non-camp Syrians living in Batman and they have been providing assistance to these non-camp Syrians
- In Nusaybin camp, officials informed UNHCR team that they assume to have about 1,000 children at school age in the camp, and they will start to register the children at school age for the coming education semester that will be starting by mid September. Camp officials also informed that they received the second hand clothing as donation and will distribute to the camp residents before the Eid.
- UNHCR Field team visited an urban school in Antakya, providing education for the non-camp Syrian children of martyrs. School officials informed that they have about 300 children registered students, and 20 teachers working in the school. Reportedly it has been set up by a national "Foundation for Orphan Children" and it is funded by Turkish businessmen in Istanbul.
- In Akcakale camp, UNHCR Field team observed that there are some makeshift tents where Syrians are living. The camp officials informed that there are some 20 families approximately 100 persons approached the camp to be admitted however due to shortage in capacity, they could not be admitted. The camp officials stated that they can admit them when there are any voluntary returns from the camp.
