

ESWG Meeting Minutes – 23rd June (UNICEF 2nd floor 12-14pm)

1) Review previous minutes and action points

The minutes and action points agreed upon and endorsed without amendment.

2) RRP6 Update

The co-chair briefed the participants that at the eleventh hours sector chairs received the revised information that basis for RRP 6 revision has been changed. The revised planning figure is 700,000 (150,000 for camp and 550,000 for outside the camp). During the revision process, all the partners have already revised the target and there is no need to perturb the partner again to re-revise the targets. So, the sector chairs decided to review the revised figures and if the revised targets are within the revised figures then there is no need for revision except the updating the figures in PPR 6 need assessment part. The new revised targets for camps are 54000 and 198000 are for out of the camp and people in host community (Jordanian) are 48,000 children. Based on the revised figure, UNICEF flatly decrease its targets by 25% which will cover mostly the whole revision.

3) WASH/EDU task force update

Co-chair thanked all members who supported the Education/WASH task force and attended the first meeting on 21st June. Co-chair briefed members on the main decisions and way forward agreed by the Task Force about the development of short guidelines of WASH provision in education facilities in HC and camps. The Task Force identified the main areas for drafting the guidelines which will be shared with SAG and ESWG members, which will take into account the MoE standards already available.

The Task Force will also include MoE representative once he/she is nominated.

4) ERF & Sector survey updates

- ERF: Chair informed that out of 6 agencies who submitted proposals, the education sector technical review committee recommended 3. Only 1 project (AVSI Foundation) was approved at further stage by OCHA review board.
- Sector Survey: The Sector survey has been reopened because of the extremely low participation of members. It has been agreed at the ISWG that the overall results would be shared (action point), but would leave the sector survey open for sectors until the end of the month. Chair reminded that the survey is very useful tool for feedback and improvements. Deadline to take the survey is 30th June.

5) AOB

- Azraq Updates: Chair confirmed that it is too early to set up an EWG in Azraq, but “unofficial” coordination is already in place with partners, thus in the meantime, ESWG at national level can be used as a coordination forum for Azraq.
- JENA: Chair confirmed that it is still ongoing and will be finished soon. A workshop is going to be organized on 10th July 2014 to share the preliminary findings by REACH team.
- Household Survey: Arushi (UNHCR) will prepare a presentation for next meeting. It was confirmed that 8000 families have answered the survey already.

6) Implication of completion criteria & NFE scale up – info for partners (Q&A with Dr Zainab MoE)

Members had the chance to ask questions about implication of the completion criteria directly to the MoE representative. Q&A will be shared with the participants in separate document after review from MoE and participants. Questions about the NFE programme scale up were asked to MoE representative. To summarize the main elements, Chairs and MoE will share a matrix with members to guide them on how they can support the MoE to scale up the NFE programmes.
