



Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	<b>813,862</b>

### Highlights

- On 29 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,272. AFAD reported that during the period of 25-29 July 2014, a total of 1,682 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,1171 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- In Ceylanpinar, a UNHCR team observed that 3 families approached the gate requesting to be admitted. One of the families consisted of 10 people including a sick child, who were immediately referred to hospital. The other two families claimed to be new-arrivals coming from the Kilis crossing. The camp management is trying to identify space in the camp.
- In Ceylanpinar camp officials also informed that due to Eid holiday they had allowed some 150 Syrians to visit their relatives in their tents. However the people refuse to leave the camp and the camp management stated that they will talk to the families to inform them that they will not be provided separate tents.
- In Kahramanmaraş a UNHCR team observed a group of approximately 200 Syrians at the gate of the camp. It was not clear whether these people were new-arrivals or they have been living in other provinces/ camps and were visiting their relatives because of Eid. The UNHCR team will follow up with the camp management.
- In Nizip camp, the officials informed that they have been allowing refugees who managed to find work in the agricultural fields in the nearby villages. Reportedly a few hundred refugee men are given daily permissions, while due to hot temperatures some work at nights.
- In Adana camp officials informed that they have prepared two rub hall tents, for unaccompanied minors (one for boys and one for girls ). Camp officials informed that the tents are ready and 8 staff including 1 Arabic speaking staff are assigned to work with children. There no UAM children placed in the center yet.
