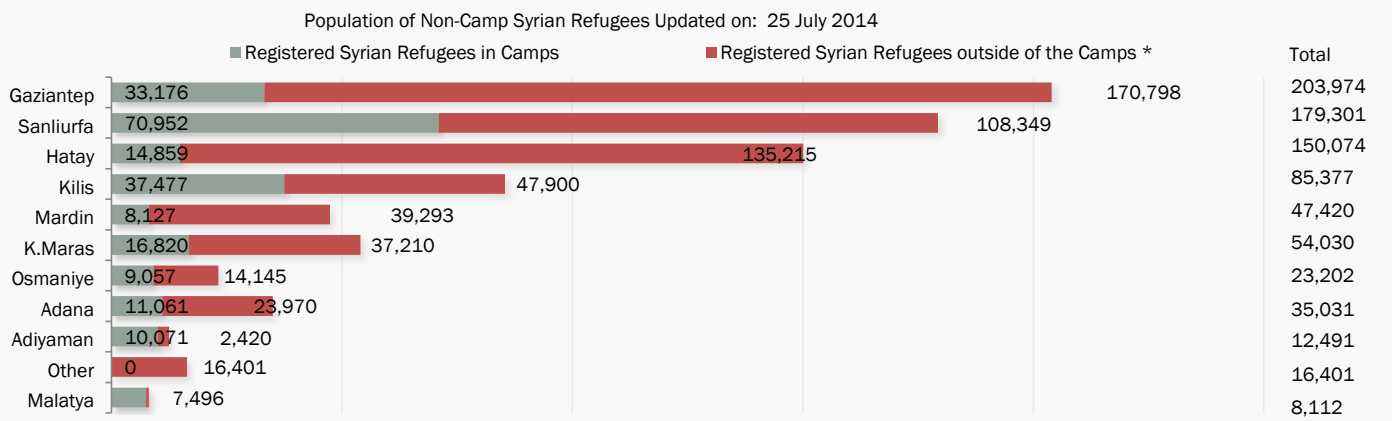
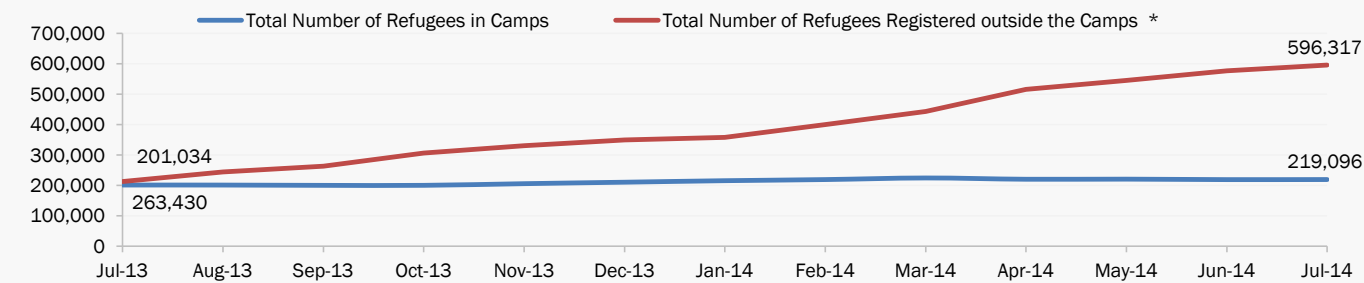
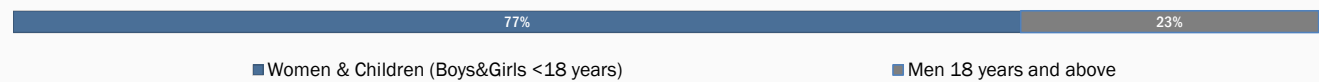


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	815,413

Highlights

- On 31 July 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 219,096. AFAD reported that during the period of 30-31 July 2014, a total of 327 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 501 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- As of end of July 2014, AFAD reported that since the beginning of the crisis (April 2011) the number of Syrians registered and accommodated in the camps reached almost 510 thousand persons of whom more than 290 thousand have returned to Syria voluntarily. However it is not reported howmany of these are multiple arrivals and returns. AFAD also reported that as of end July 2014, 21,303 Syrian children were born in Turkey since the beginning of the crisis.
- AFAD also reported that as of end of July 2014, since the beginning of the crisis (April 2011), the Government of Turkey provided more than 4,3 million inpatient/outpatient medical interventions to Syrian refugees in Turkey. Reportedly more than 2.5 million of these medical interventions are provided in the health facilities in the camps while about 1,8 million were provided in the state hospitals in various cities.
- During the visits to the camps, UNHCR Field teams were informed that the managers of the different camps are facing challenges with people whom they allowed to visit their relatives/friends in the camps during Eid holiday and who now refuse to leave the camps.
- In Nizip, UNHCR team observed that a group of 20-25 Syrians is waiting at the gate. The camp officials reported that they do not want to allow them in the camp but provided space to meet their relatives outside the camp. Reportedly they were temporarily accommodated in the waiting area of Nizip-1 camp and were referred to Nusaybin a few months ago. However they did not stay there and returned to Nizip. Due to shortage of space they could not be admitted to neither camp in Nizip. UNHCR will follow up with the camp management to see what solution can be found for the group.
