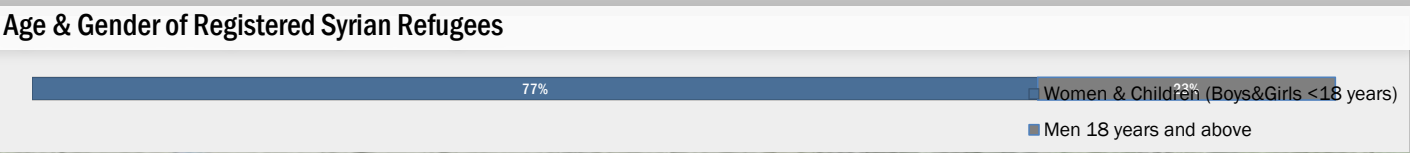
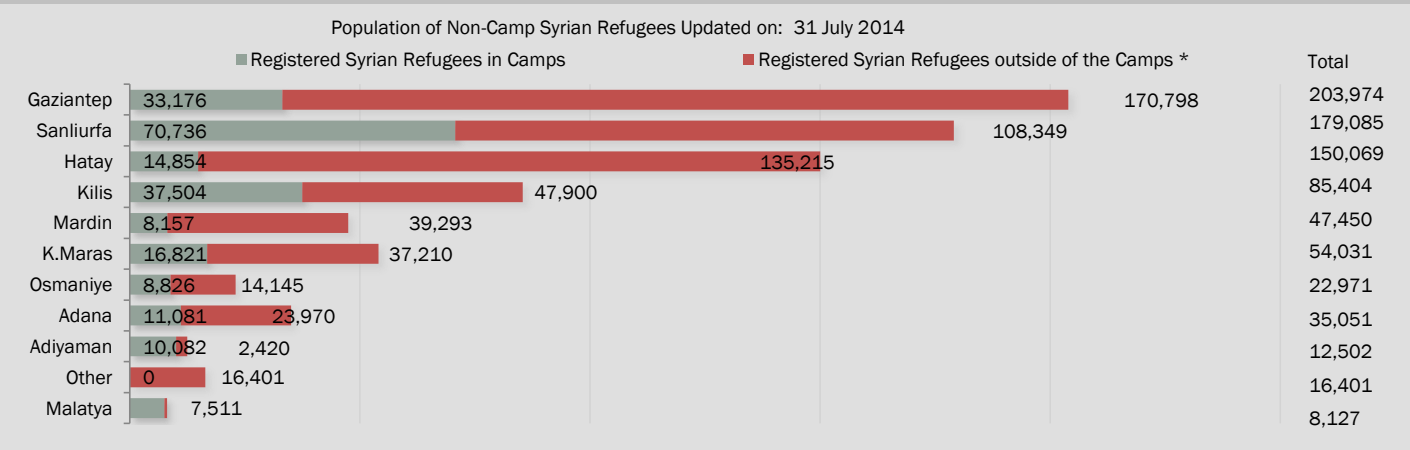
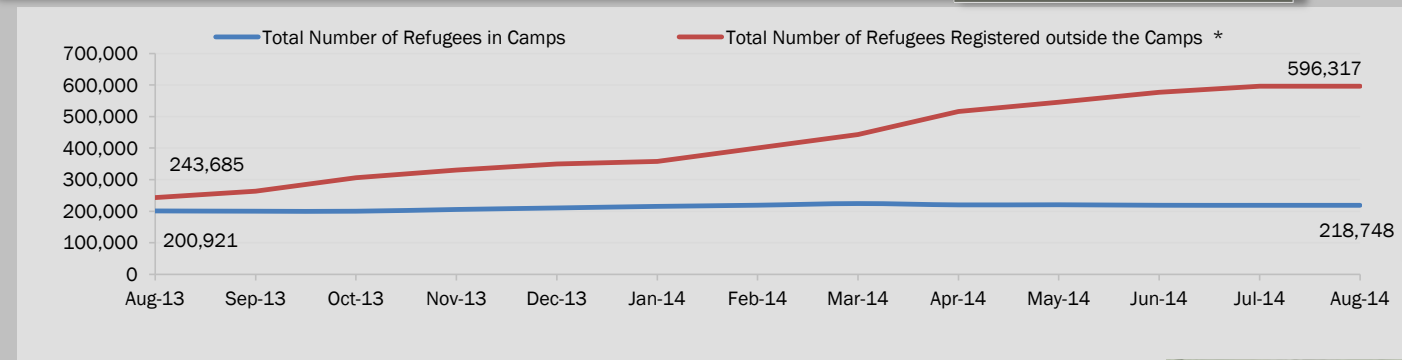

Highlights

- On 03 August 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 218,748. AFAD reported that during the period of 31 July-03 August 2014, a total of 973 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,339 Syrians voluntarily returned to Syria.
- As reported in the previous week, after the preparation of a shelter for unaccompanied minors (UAMs) in Adana Saricam camp, officials in Adana Saricam camp informed UNHCR that they received 7 UAMs (2 girls and 5 boys) who were temporarily accommodated in Nizip-1 Camp. A UNHCR Team is in close contact with the camp officials and following the situation of the children and their access to services.
- Camp officials in Kilis Elbeyli camp informed UNHCR that they have established a youth committee composed of 15 refugees (7 females and 8 males) and that they have started to have their weekly meetings with the school director. The school manager reported that the local authorities also support the establishment of refugee committees in the camps and requested that some activities be planned.
- In Viransehir camp, officials informed UNHCR that a new supermarket has been identified and included in the WFP-Kizilay food-card program through which refugees can do their shopping in town. The camp officials reported that it was agreed with the supermarket to provide a shuttle between the camp and Viransehir town.
- During a visit to Viransehir camp on Monday, a UNHCR team observed a group of some 200 Syrians waiting at the gate of the camp. The refugees claimed to be approximately 50 families and to have arrived some ten days ago. It is not clear whether they are all new comers or not. The UNHCR team talked to local authorities, who indicated that they have been waiting for instructions from AFAD Ankara for the admission of the group or their transfer to another camp, which will be Nusaybin. Camp officials reported that two persons among the group got sick and have been transferred health facilities in the camp for initial intervention and then sent to hospital.
