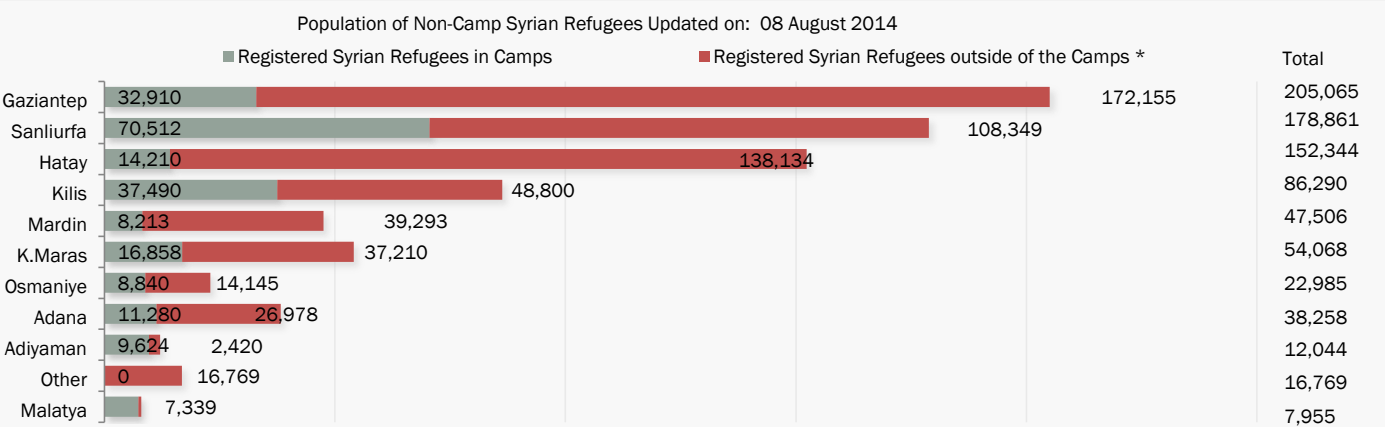
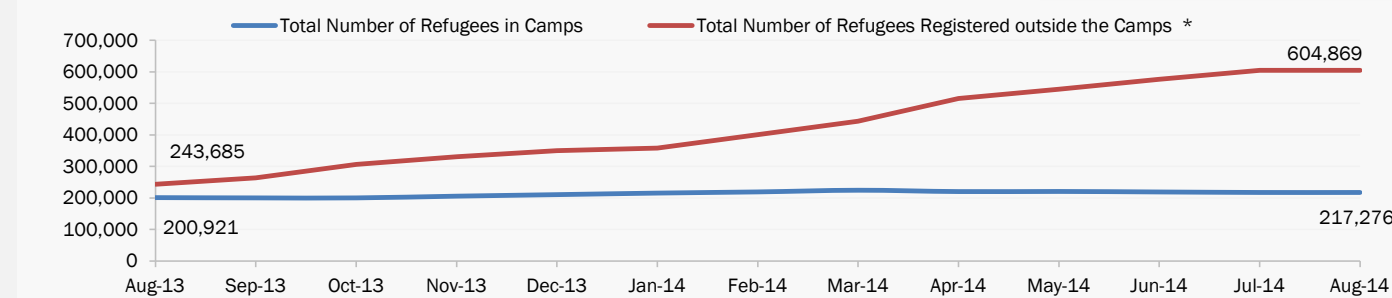
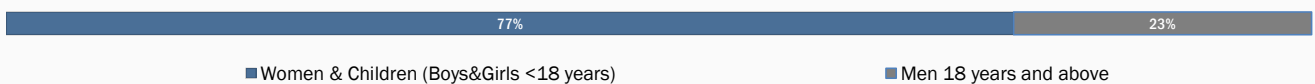


Total Number of Refugees Registered and with Registration Appointments	822,145

Highlights

- On 10 August 2014, AFAD - the Disaster and Emergency Management Agency of Government of Turkey - announced that the total number of Syrians registered and assisted in 22 camps located in 10 provinces was 217,276. AFAD reported that during the period of 08-10 August 2014, a total of 708 Syrians were admitted and registered in the camps and 1,327 Syrians have voluntarily returned to Syria.
- The UNHCR organized and facilitated an activity called "Festival without Borders" in Ceylanpinar camp on Thursday - 07 Aug. 2014 for 85 children between ages 7 and 18 with special needs. The festival included a series of events and activities which were carried out with the support of the camp management and 15 youth volunteers. Visits were made to individual tents to share information about the festival. Activities included wall painting with finger-paints, t-shirt painting, listening to audio books in Arabic language, movie screening with sign language etc. Among those who participated in the festival were children and families as well as the Sub-Governor, the AFAD Provincial Director, and a representative from AFAD Ankara.
- In Nizip-1 the camp officials stated that depending on their capacity and tents becoming available after voluntary returns, they continue to admit new arrivals referred to them by local authorities and the directorate of religious affairs office. Camp officials stated that recently 13 tents became available following voluntary returns of some camp residents, and they have admitted 4 families who were referred by the office of the religious affairs with the authorization of local governorate. Also 2 families (about 10 persons) were exchanged with Islahiye camp.
- In Kahramanmaraş, UNHCR team observed a group of 6 families (about 50 persons) waiting at the gate of the camp to be admitted. Refugees claimed that they came from Aleppo. Camp officials informed that they have informed the local authorities for the instructions. Reportedly, they will most likely be transferred to another camp (Nusaybin or Viransehir).
- The preparations for the new education semester (2014-2015) are on-going in all the camps. Camp managements and the staff responsible from the education issues in the camps informed that they have started to register the new children, starting the new semester, catch-up classes in some of the camps to prepare the children for the new semester and also conducting house visits to raise awareness among the families of the children who dropped out in the previous year. In Akcakale camp which is the most populated camp among the 22 camps, officials informed that they have already 120 persons signed up for Turkish language classes which will be provided by TOMER. Officials also informed UNHCR that about 1,000 children have so far been registered for the kindergarten classes.
